Reference is made to the Incoming Telegram received by your Department on December 10, 1963, from Tangler, Morocco, your control number 6690. It was stated therein that Thomas Eli Davis, Jr., was being held by the Moroccan National Security Police because of a letter in his handwriting which referred "In passing to 'Oswald' and to Kennedy assassination."

Reference is also made to the Incoming Telegram received by your Department from Rabat, Morocco, on December 16, 1963, your control number 11115. In this Telegram it was stated that Howard Loch Schulman was arrested by the Noroccan Surete after having reportedly stated that he was wanted by United States authorities in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy.

In May, June, and July, 1963, you were furnished several memoranda concerning Thomas Eli Davis, III, possibly identical with the individual arrested in Tangier. He reportedly had been recruiting men for an invasion of Haiti; however, it BY COURIER that his scheme was actually to become acquainted with the "soldier of fortune" type of individual so that he 2 2 DE might acquire background information for an article, he mlaned 105 R2555 100 to white. **REC-40** COMM - EBI Since 1961 you have been furnished a number of reports on a continuing basis concerning one Howard Loch Schulnan who has in the past expressed pro-Castro sympathies and made an Moh unauthorized trip to Cuha. It is requested that you expeditiously secure, if at all possible, the exact nature of Davis' reference to Oswald and the President's assassination. It is further requested that this Bureau be completely apprised of any oral statements he may have made concerning this matter to the Moroccan National Security Police or representatives of your Department in Tangier.

It is also requested that this Bureau be furnished all details of statements made by Schulman while in Morocco relative to the assassination. With regard to Schulman, it is further requested that we be advised as to the date of his arrival and nature of his activities in Morocco as well as identity of his intended destination should he leave that country.
