

JFK assassination records appeals

inconsistencies and unserious, unnecessary and improper withholdings

Whether the claim is of privacy or only source the withholdings within attached 62-109060- 4817 are neither proper nor necessary.

They are typical of the FBI's misuse of FOIA for harassment and for escalating costs and time wastes under FOIA.

In this case the proof is within the single Serial. It discloses the name it withholds, of Sgt. V.T. Horan, thus also disclosing the lack of need for the withholding and the persisting violation of the Attorney General's policy on FOIA.

Reading the records does not disclose any reason for there to be any interest in one Jack Carter, a painter, or any connection between him and the JFK assassination investigation.

Why the FBI omitted this in the records intended to be "suitable" for distribution outside the FBI I don't know.

However, a person of that name, also reported to be a painter, was a fellow roomer with Oswald at the 1026 North Beckley rooming house. Also, he reportedly had a brother who was of some interest to others (not me), including, as I recall, Garrison.
