Dear Mr. Weisberg:

Reference is made to your requests for the Dallas and New Orleans Field Office Files pertaining to the investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The enclosed documents consist of materials referred to other agencies and returned to the FBI for release to you. We are also enclosing a copy of the appropriate worksheets.

Excisions have been made from the documents and/or entire documents have been withheld pursuant to the following subsections of Title 5, United States Code, Section 552 (Freedom of Information Act):

- (b) (1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to Executive Order 12065 in the interest of national defense or foreign policy;
- (b) (3) information specifically exempted from disclosure by the following statutes: Title 26, United States Code, Section 6103; and the Immigration and Nationality Act, Section 222F;
- (b) (6) materials contained in sensitive records such as personnel or medical files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b) (7) investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the disclosure of which would:

- (C) constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of another person;
- (D) reveal the identity of an individual who has furnished information under confidential circumstances or reveal information furnished only by such a person and not apparently known to the public or otherwise accessible to the FBI or other agencies except by overt means.

A total of 1,169 pages were processed and 384 pages are being released.

If you so desire, you may appeal to the Associate Attorney General from any denial contained herein. Appeals should be directed in writing to the Associate Attorney General (Attention: Office of Privacy and Information Appeals), United States Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. 20530, within thirty days from receipt of this letter. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal" or "Information Appeal." Please cite the FOIPA number assigned to your request so that it may be easily identified.
