Reference is made to my letter dated March 21, 1978, to you.

Processing of the New Orleans Field Office files pertaining to the above has been completed. This material consists of 4,832 pages, and is being forwarded to you, along with inventories, under separate cover, in two boxes on today's date.

For your information, data pertaining to Clay Shaw's and David Ferrie's involvement in the investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy or in District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, was channelled into the New Orleans Field Office files regarding these investigations and no separate files as such were maintained on Clay Shaw or David Ferrie.

Some documents surfaced during processing which originated in or contained information obtained from other governmental agencies. These documents have been referred to those agencies for a determination as to the releasability of information therein. Upon receipt of these documents, you will be advised accordingly.
