Dear Mr. Shaw,

This relates to both FBI and CIA access and to prior appeals in both cases, particularly but not exclusively to good faith, due diligence and in general the nature of the searches and the files searched and not searched. It also relates to an appropriate machine for FBI non-compliance under FOIA and I believe to assuming non-compliance as a result of agency.

The FBI's position is that all the records are in Central "files" and that a search of the index of Central Files is adequate for compliance with FOIA requests. It claims that no other searching or reviewing under FOIA will fit within its efforts to make other searches, which I have also assumed.

I have just reviewed the FBI's list of the Central "files." Three file types and numbers do not include all records the FBI has and do not include listings appropriate to several of my information requests.

Obviously the FBI has the records I will refer to. Possibly obvious there is no appropriate file subject for them in the FBI's list. This appears to me that retrieval is automatically precluded in searching Central Records. It also appears to me that illustrations here relevant records outside Central Files. (I have already appealed refusal to search Central files and provided you with photocopies they exist.)

Specific items of my "log communication" requests relate to the Laboratory (show copies how ~~and~~ keeps no permanent records, no deposition), to surveillance and to intelligence and information given to other agencies with subject headings appear in the FBI's own list of files. Therefore I ask how you can properly process my appeal where the search for information of these descriptions is limited to where the FBI does not file and keep those kinds of records?

Going along with this there is Condition two of this letter, the FBI does have records relating to the propaganda efforts and to what it does for and with without filing under FOIA, which is called "General Patterns," not public information, etc. (There is no file for the public information, the Bureau Affairs records.) As I have informed you the FBI also uses CO or "Laboratory Research Patterns" for political findings, illustrated by Jim Garrison findings.

As I review records I have it to becoming increasingly apparent that a thorough search of FOIA files is required in the May case. On prior appeals I have asked for this. You have not responded, to the best of my recollection, or distinguished from not acting on the appeal, which you have not. So once again, old as that case is, I ask if you will please respond, first to whether and then you will have found and then relating to compliance? Kindly,
