

JFK assassinations records appeals Harold Weisberg 10/14/79  
Withheld records - ticklers not provided

While it is not possible that FBI FOIA agents were not aware of the existence and the need for the existence of ticklers in this massive investigation not one has been produced voluntarily and the one<sup>s</sup> that was, ultimately, produced was gutted after my request for it.

I thus can call to your attention on appeal those ticklers the existence of which are proven in specific records, other than by general citations of records relating to FBI needs and practises.

There is a marginal note on 105-82555- 4295 reading "1 cc. retained as tickler RDR." These are the initials of Richard D. Rogge, supervisor in the Criminal Section of the General Investigative Division, also referred to as "case agent." He is one of those rushed to Dallas immediately from FBIHQ, with Inspector Halley.

The subject matter is the missed shot, played down by the FBI, which ignored it for about a half year, only then to play dirty tricks with it. This subject matter may well have been within discovery in C.A. 75-226, but had the tickler been disclosed then it might have hurt the Department's defense of that case and would have hidden the existence of these many ticklers.

Normal destruction procedures did not apply to this case, a permanently open case, according to Director Hoover's Commission testimony. Rogge's ticklers should still exist, have not been provided, and along with all the others I renew my request for it and for them.
