

JFK assassination records appeals  
Underlying records not provided - Jim Garrison  
Files not searched  
Ticklers

Attached is 62-109060-5126, captioned James C. Garrison Fraud Against the Government. I have several reasons for providing this copy.

One is that I do not recall seeing the underlying information in other records. This, if I am correct, means that the relevant underlying information has not been provided. It may also bear on the existence of ticklers no copies of which have been provided. At least some of the underlying information would be of New Orleans origin and would ordinarily include records/information not provided to FBIHQ.

We have FBI testimony to the effect that only original filings have Serial Numbers and that the indices refer to the original only. However, this record, which has a Serial Number, also has a notation on the side, only partly legible, referring to the original being filed elsewhere. The file from which this copy comes is not the Fraud Against the Government file and as I have appealed, without response, there are other and undisclosed Garrison files.

I will be providing you with another illustration of the inaccuracy of this testimony, which relates to the searches in C.A. 75-1996, in a separate appeal relating to Milton Viorst, who had the temerity to send a copy of an article to the Director.

It appears that the JFK searches were knowingly incomplete and that, arbitrarily and capriciously, they were limited to records that by themselves do not permit compliance with my request.

I believe it is appropriate, therefore, that copies of the directives under which the searches were made be provided and I ask for this, please.
