

JFK assassination records appeals

→ Unjustifiable and unnecessary withholdings
Withholding the reasonably segregable

Attached is most of 62-109060- 4606, a decoded teletype from New Orleans to FBIHQ, copy to Dallas, of 2/21/67, or about the time the Garrison matter got in the papers. As you will see the entire text of the first page and about half of the second are withheld in their entirety.

From what is not obliterated it appears that what is obliterated includes reasonably segregable information if all if not within the public domain,

From the content of what follows, all of which is within the public domain, it does appear that the withholding is neither necessary nor proper nor in accord with historical case standards.

Information relating to the Garrison adventures and the FBI's attitude toward it is of historical importance.

In the latter pages, not copied, withholdings include the name of an official who made available what is required to be made available to the public, registrations under the registration act.
