Dear Mr. Bresson,

This is my request under the FOLA for capies of the FSE Headquarters file on Lee Harvey Causid. If you will please let me know the cost I'll send a check.

Then we met this sping I told you informally of several other requests I'd be making so you might have time to look into them. I now went to make these requests formally.

Gno is for copies of documents relating to the Silver Shirts, purticular what may help you locate them, one relating to a mouting with them Congressman Thoriseless and them Army Chief of Staff Halin Gradg. I gave those to the FSI about early 1940.

Another is to see, not to have copies of new unless saking copies is eagler for you and not too costly for me, of two Sam anatour notice picture films the FSI did not give the Warren Commission. The names of the young sam who provided these films are Dayle and Martin. They are films of Osuald being arrested on or about August 6, 1965, on Camal Street, New Orleans. They include him giving out leaflets, too, I believe, With regard to these films and what follows I would also like copies of any analyses of these films and any reports or other FBI papers not given to the Warren Commission.

Shortly after the assassination the FMI obtained from WDSW a copy of its Oscald footage. NDSW has provided me with a copy of the film the FMI returned. I was also informed by the WDSW news director and by a friend who reviewed this footage prior to giving it to the FMI that what was returned is not the complete footage. The FMI made or was provided with stills or both. These are referred to in FMI and Secret Service reports I have but are not in the Warren Commission files. The FMI reports refer to content of those stills not in the footage returned to WDSW. By request is fer copies of the stille, SwiO glosmys, and to see the original footage prior to ordering a copy, which I may or may not want to do.

I am tware of your position that you provide copies but not other access. You are aware of my position, that the law requires both access and copies but that access does not require the applicant to accept copies of the government's selection only. However, I would prefer to avoid any dispute on this now. If the cost of a duplicate of the EBSU footage is not too great for me, I will compromise and merely may it, without waiving the general principle. I would also like to know if the Fal's duplication of this footage in 1963 was made where EBSU sent the footage returned to it for duplicating for me, Fanamerican films, on Respect St., New Orleans.
