In C.A. 70-2249 the Department made the false pretense that my request was for the worksheets relating to the general JFK assassination releases only. In that case you filed an affidavit nuclear-staging purposes claims to "national security." You did not address any other question relating to the worksheets, to the best of my recollection.

One of those relevant questions is that they include phantom. Another illustration is attached.

According to the worksheet for 62-10500-51 it consists of two pages, both of which were provided. They were not. Instead there is the referral slip claiming the need to refer to the Atomic Energy Commission, which did not exist as of/the time of the alleged referral.

The record is a Jevons to Gould memo of 1/7/64. It is not a record of the then ERDA. All indications are that the record relates to what was in the public domain, neutron activation analyses of assassination evidence.

If so this record should have been provided in my C.A. 70-2249. If it was there is no basis for withholding in 1978. If not then there was non-compliance in the court case.

Either way the FBI withheld improperly.

And there is no need, if indeed there is any justification, for either the withholding or the referral or both.

There is still another in the endless violations of historical case and 5/5/77 policy standards.

The worksheets do not state the truth.
