Attached are copies of Mr. Bresson's letter of 8/11/80 to me and my response of the 17th, which I intend as part of my appeal.

I finally received what is represented as the King bulkies, those you wrote me two years ago were then to be provided, with Mr. Bresson's letter.

As I inform, really remind Mr. Bresson, the Court and I were informed in C.A. 75-1996 that I was being provided with every non-exempt page of the FBIHQ MURKIN file. You should be aware of the history of my not getting the bulkies from my prior appeals.

I find Mr. Bresson's letter excessively evasive and subject to the kinds of future misuses with which I have prior experience with the FBI.

He does not state that I have now received all the FBIHQ MURKIN bulkies and I know very well that they do not include records that were sent to FBIHQ and belong in the bulky file. He does try to indicate what is not true, that I have received all the records that pertain to ballistics, spectrographic and neutron activation testing. As my prior appeals state, I have not. (True also of the JFK records.) I know of no reason not to suspect the FBI when it puts what is not necessary in a letter that remains in its files. On the other hand, I have reason to be suspicious - and I am.

At the same time, the FBI tries to avoid outright lies by it in its files.

I have no way of knowing what the FBI does and does not have in its reading room. I do know I have copies of some of its records it did not place in its reading room. Therefore, without assurance that I have every page of every bulky, I have no choice but to believe that I do not, despite the FBI's contrary assurances to the Court and to me.

You have not responded to my appeals pertaining to the tests cited above. Will you please let me know if you are not going to act promptly so I can ask counsel to take that up with the Court, which is under the impression that you were placed in charge of these matters?
