SUBJECT: Security of V6113 - President John F. Kennedy Assassination

I talked to [REDACTED] OCR [REDACTED] about V6113 President John F. Kennedy Assassination, pointing out that source requires film be CIA Internal Use Only, but that there was no guidance as to classification. [REDACTED] said, as he has said before to me, that the Caveat CIA Internal Use Only has to be used with a security classification.

While he did not feel that the film should be Confidential, he sees no other solution to the problem. Therefore the film should be classified Confidential/CIA Internal Use Only.
