PREPART ON OFFICER'S DUTTES IN REGARDS TO OFFICEP TIPPIT'S MURDER

Saturday, November 23. 1963 at approximately 12:30 pm Lt. Wells told my partmer Y. B. Funtpowery, and me to do to Oak Cliff Cab Co. in Oak Cliff and rick up a cal driver by the name of W. H. Cossins. He said this man was a witness to the shooting of Officer J. B. Tippit.

When we arrived at the Gab Co. at Davis and Tyler in Oak Cliff, we were advised that Mr. Scongins was on duty; that at that time he was at the Addiphus Hotel. Since we were coing to bring Mr. Scoggins to gity hall, he was advised by radio to meet us at 610 S. Akard, the main office of the Gab Go. We picked Mr. Scoppins up at 610 S. Akard and brought him to gity hall. We arrived at gity hall at approximately 1:30 pm. I took an affidavit from Mr. coggins in which he stated that he saw Officer Timpit stop on Tenth Street at Patton in Oak Cliff; that a man was walking down the midewalk at this location. Officer Timpit stopped his sound can even with the man and got out of the car. As Officer Timpit started around in front of the squad car the man pulled a pistol and shot Officer Timpit three or four times. Mr. Scoppins further stated in his affidavit that he hotified the Gab Co. by radio to send an ambulance.

This is the extent of my investigation in the Tippit murder.
