REPORT ON OFFICER'S DUTIES IN REGARDS TO TIPPIT'S MURDER G. N. DHOFTTY - A.76

November 22, 1963, about 7:00 PM, Lt. T. P. Wells gave Tet. C. W. Brown and syself information that Mrs. Virginia Davis, help East 10th, WR 3-8120, had found an empty .38 shell in her front yard. We went to her house and talked with her and her sister, Jeanette Davis, of the same address. We brought both of the women to the Detail Room of the Police Department, where they identified the Harvey Oswald as the man they saw walking across their front yard unleading his pistel after they had heard shots and saw the officer had been shot. They identified Lee Harvey Oswald as the #2 man in the line. We brought the Davis women to Homicide office where they gave affidavits. I took an affidavit from Virginia Davis, and Det. Brown took affidavit from Jeanette Davis. The spent .38 shell that Virginia Davis gave me was submitted to Lt. J. C. Day in the Crime Leb. We carried these women back to their home.
