November 22, 1963, about 7:00 PM, Lt. T. F. Wells gave Fet. C. W. Brown and symelf information that Wrs. Virginia Davis, h00 East 10th, WH 3-8120, had found an empty .38 shell in her front yard. We wont to her house and talked with her and her sister, Jeanette Davis, of the same address. We brought both of the women to the Fetail Boom of the Folice Department, where they identified The Harvey Oswald as the man they saw walking across their front yard unleading his pistol after they had heard shots and saw the officer had been shot. They identified Lee Harvey Gawald as the #2 man in the line. We brought the Pavis women to Homicide office where they gave affidavits. I took an affidavit from Virginis Davis, and Fet. Brown took affidavit from Jeanette Davis. The ment .38 shell that Virginia Pavis gave me was submitted to Lt. J. C. Day in the Grime Leb. We carried these women back to their home.
