REPORT ON OFFICER'S DUTIES IN RECAPDS TO THE PRESIDENT'S MURDER C. N. DEOPTTY - #176

Priday, Movember 22, 1963, I was on day off. I was called by Lt. T. P. Wells at 1:30 PK to come back to work, that the President had been killed. I got to work at 2:00 PM. I worked in the office answering telephone calls until 3:30 FM. At this time I received information from Lt. Wells that Mrs. Olemn S. Holcomb, 1000 Oilpin, FE 7-2188, had received a telephone call, and e woman said, "Repeat and report the information you heard. It ties in with what just happened." Mrs. Holcomb asked the woman what number she was calling ings, and she said FL 7-2188. This number was listed to Phillip Oliver, 5350 Surry Circle. I talked with Mrs. Oliver, who is a part time model. She said Mrs. Erms Austin, 1620 Cypress, RL 4-7995, had called her and was the woman who got the wrong number. The information that Mrs. Oliver gave to Mrs. Austin was as follows: Thursday, November 21, 1963, Mrs. Oliver celled Mrs. Austin at ML 1-700R and evidently was cut into a conversation that was going on between two men. They were talking about demanding some time from Governor Connally and Vice Fresident Johnson to hear their side on a bond hearing or resoning of property. Mrs. Oliver heard the name John Claughter used and believed it to be one of the men that was talking. Ers. Will ver made for call again to Mrs. Austin and told her what she had just heard. I returned to the office and worked in the office answering the telephone. About 6:00 PM, Lt. Wells gave C. W. Brown and myself information that Mr. C. J. Mc Watters was driving Piedmont Pue and was due at Commerce and Harwood at 6:15 PM. We met Mr. Mc Watters and carried him to the Dotail Room. At 6:30 PM, Mr. Mc Watters made identification of Oswald as #2 men in four man line up. Mr. Mc Watter
