> Subject: Arrest of Lee Harvey Oswald

On November 22, 1965 at approximately 2:00 P.M., Detective B. K. Carroll and I were instructed by Lieutenant E. Kaminski to go to the Oak Cliff area where Officer J. D. Tippit had been whot.

While carcute to Oak Cliff, we received information on our police radio that the suspect had entered the Texas Theatre, 231 west Jefferson. When we arrived at the Texas Theatre, we were told that the suspect had gone to the belony. While searching the belongy, I heard seasons call from the lover floor that the suspect was down there. I ran down the steps, and as I seared the bottom, I spraised my left ankle.

I then proceeded to the location where Officers P. L. Bentley, H. H. Nelbonald, G. T. Walker, and other efficers were attempting to disarm Lee Harvey Counid. During this time, Lee Harvey Counid kept yelling, "I am not remisting arrest. I am not remisting arrest. I want to complain of police brutality."

Captain W. E. Westbrook them told several of the officers to take Oswald directly to the City Hall.

Officers B. K. Carrell, Sergeant Jerry Hill, P. L. Bentley, C. T. Walker, and ayeelf transported Cowald to the City Hall.

Enroute to the City Hall, Countd refused to answer all questions, and he kept repeating, "day as I being arrested? I know I was earrying a gun, but why size as I being arrested?"

Lee Harvey Oswald was released to Captain Fritz at the Homicide and Hobbery Bureau by the transporting efficers.
