

Q. It is your statement that you have never known him to carry a pistol?

(Mrs. Warner volunteers the information that Ruby stated that on occasions he had to be stern and severe with patrons at the Club and the employees, but that he always conducted himself as a gentleman and never gave her reason to believe he was anything but a gentleman.
