

Oswald's name did not appear, however, on a "risk list" the Bureau gave the Secret Service. Turner states, "All my previous contacts with the men of the Secret Service convince me that they would have stepped in to neutralize Oswald--if only they then had the information they have now. But as we have seen, the Secret Service knew nothing about Oswald. In this respect, I believe the FBI was negligent."

The SAGA article also charges that "jealousy and a lack of cooperation and communication between law-enforcement agencies" allowed the President's assassin to succeed. "For years," says Turner, "there have been recurring rumors of rivalry between the FBI and the Secret Service. But to me, as a former FBI agent, they are more than rumors. Sooner or later, I believe the whole story will come out. It is beginning to already."
