in Minsk there was a 35 ft. ~~statue~~ monument to Stalin which stood even after the first denunciation of Stalin by Kaukazov, unlike the monument of Stalin in Leningrad which was torn down immidiately. This impressive bronze and marble structure has stood for as long as it has due to the efforts of diehard Stalinist such as Com. Petrovsky & the O.G.N.R. office in Minsk and others. However, after the 22nd Congress meeting when Krushchev again denounced Stalin, on Nov. 5, two days before the Nov. 7 revolutionary celebrations, a force of 100 men descended upon the then Stalin square ~~statue~~ (now Lenin square) and with bulldozers and piledriver ~~not~~ commenced to tear up (not salvage) the structure. They must have been very enthusiastic because next day they had removed the 10 ton bronze ~~statue~~ figure of a man revered by the older generation and abhored by the sarcastic younger generation.

The most remarkable thing about the destruction of this giant monument was that work was ceased on the 6th of November, but started again on the 21st the very day a big parade of workers came by. The monument was right across from the reviewing stand at which was
