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red and white signs and slogans hanging on the walls. Liebergen held the title (besides communist black workers of communist labor, this movement was started under Stalin a decade ago, in order to get the most out of the extreme patriotism driven into Soviet children at an early age. Indeed Liebergen is an skilled mechanic and metal worker and for his work he receives 130-140 rubles - month minus deduction. This shop party secretary together with the section party chief usually selects workers for the title stock workers of communist labor, these people are not necessarily communist party members although it helps in its case was party membership helps in any facet of life in the U.S.S.R. Factory meeting of the "Collectives" are as numerous as to be suggesting.

Take for instance during the month the following meetings and lectures are scheduled: 1. prof. union which discuss to work of the prof union in gathering dues paying out presents on vacation orders (p. 24.); 2. political information (usually Tuesday on the lunch hour); 3. young communist meeting (2) in the 6 and 21 of every month; 4. production committee (made up of workers, discuss ways of improving work); 5. Communist party meeting (2) in month called by the section communist party sec.; 6. school of communist labor meeting (compulsory) every Wednesday, and sport meeting, or month non-compulsory a total of 15 meetings a month 14 of which are compulsory for a communist party member and 12 compulsory for all others. These meetings are always held after work or on the lunch hour they are never held on working time! Absenteeism is by no means allowed. After long years of hard discipline especially under the Stalin regime, no worker will invite the sad displeasure of the party men and involuntarily the factory party became by trying to slip out of the way or giving little attention to what is being said.

A strong sight indeed is the picture of the local party men delivering a political sermon to a group of usually robust simple working men who through some strong process have been turned to stone. Turned to stone all except the hard faced communists with roving eyes looking for any bonus-making catch of inattentiveness on the part of any workers. A sad sight to anyone not use to it. But the reactions are philosophical. "How like the lecture?" "Nobody," "but it's compulsory." Compulsory attendance at factory meetings isn't the only way to form spontaneous demonstrations. The "great October revolution" demonstrations, the May Day demonstrations are all formed in the same way. Not well so spontaneous meetings for distinguished guests. The well organized party men mark off the names of the hundreds of workers organized to arrive at a certain place at a given time. No choice, however small, is left to the discretion of the individual.

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
