Information from Mrs. Bill Randle, 2800 N. 5th, Irving, Texas, 750 5665 that her son, James Franklin Frasier, 16/18, same address, took Lee Gold to work on the morning of April 16, 1963, and that the two could not a low receipt in the back seat of her brother's Buick, which was a dark blue, 1963, Texas license #Y-3046. (See her affidavit). She said her son had been home but visiting their step-father, Mr. Williams at Ardmore Hospital, and with Jonathan Daniels, but they didn't have a key to William's there. He finally got Williams at the Irving Professional Center, Brown St., and contacted Lt. McCabe of the Irving, P. D. and arranged to check there for Frasier. Lt. McCabe went to the hospital and checked the bed the boy at the Irving P. C. He went there immediately and got Frasier who was accompanied by McCabe went to the Irving Professional Center and searched Frasier's car, license #X-3926. He found nothing of importance. He then went to the home of Frasier and he showed as where he kept his .30-06 cal. rifle and box of ammunition (property never issued). Frasier's sister, Mrs. Randle, came to the location and he and Mrs. Randle to the homicide office. Affidavit was taken from Mrs. Randle, interrogated and run on the polygraph with negative results. Affidavit was then given Frasier. Frasier and his sister were then returned to Irving on 4-16-63.
