Sir:

At approximately 8:30 s.m., August 7, 1968, I received a telephone call at my home from Alvin V. Oser, who identified himself as the Assistant District Attorney of New Orleans, Louisiana, He stated he would like to come to my residence and ask my a few questions about the assessination of President Kennedy.

I had been awakened by his call, and told him it would be all right, and about 9:30 a.m., August 7, 1968, Mr. Over and an Englishman by the name of Towny (unknown last name) came to my residence and got me out of bed.

Hefore the interview, I told Mr. Over that I couldn't testify to anything that wasn't in the Warren Commission report. He stated that he didn't want anything class. Mr. Over used a tape recorder to tape the interview. His questions pertained to my position; to the President's position; to which way Governor Commelly was sitting in relation to the President; and to what happened when they were shot. Mr. Over also took a picture of me with a 35 mm camere and stated that he would send me a subpoena September 10, 1968; but, not to hence it until he called me.

I contacted Deputy Chief R. H. Winters on August 12, 1968, and he instructed me not to honor any out of State subpoens until I could talk to the City Attorney and obtain his permission, or that of Chief Batchelor.
