Dear Mr. Rubenstein:

Sholem Alechem. Are you questioning if I am a Jewess or of Jewish descent? No, it is not my wish to trick you or mislead you in any matter so I must honestly say that I am not of Jewish descent. My only claim is a great love for all the people of Israel as well as my love of God. The explanation of myself is of very little importance for I am deeply concerned and interested in you.

It was during November 1963 my first concern for you arose when hearing your name. My husband and I discussed the very real possibility that you were probably Jewish and thus started the prayers for you. It makes absolutely no difference to me whether mankind finds you guilty or innocent of a specific sin. The issue is how the God of Israel finds you before Him. We must all come before our God in judgement one day and His answer, of course, will be determined by what we have done in our hearts with the Messiah before we meet Him in that final day.

Today when reading the newspaper it quoted you as saying, "I cannot magnify the great acquaintance I'm making with the Bible. One of the guards - with another faith - he's so human and considerate." The article went on to say
