THE FAMOUS ENGINE GENERAL - CIVIL WAR LOCOMOTIVE. This old engine has been completely re-conditioned by the L & N and is now capable of running under its own steam. It is being currently exhibited in the country in connection with the Civil War Centennial. It was made famous when it was captured by Union Soldiers - James A. Andrews and his men - at Big Shanty, Georgia, 1864, attempted to burn bridges and cut the Confederate Army from its base of supplies. The engine was overtaken and captured in the Great Locomotive Chase which ensued by the Engine Texas which had been commandeered by the Confederate train crew of the General. The story of Andrews Raiders and the Great Locomotive Chase is one of the most thrilling exploits of the Civil War.
