As per information received, subject was allegedly engaged as a tutor in romance languages at the University of Texas, from 11-1-44 to 6-30-45, and at that time resided at 101 1/2 West 19th Street, Austin, Texas.

Records of payroll at the University of Texas indicate that subject's last check was mailed to him in care of PANTEPEC OIL COMPANY, Aprapoda #23, Maturin Manogas, Venezuela, in 1945.

2-17-64

As per information received, subject is alleged to have known the Oswalds better than anyone. John Hall alleged that subject's son-in-law, Gary Taylor, drove Oswald around quite a bit, and Hall is under the impression that Taylor is the one who helped the Oswalds move from Fort Worth to Dallas.

11-25-64

As per the San Antonio Express, subject was a friend, both of the family of the late president John F. Kennedy and his assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald.

Subject, a business promoter, now living in Haiti, has a series of business ventures in which he is associated with the government of President Francois Duvalier.

Subject related that when he came to the United States in 1938, and worked as a perfume salesman in New York City, he and his brother spent the summer at Belpport, Long Island, where he met Mrs. Jack Bouvier and her daughter. The friendship has continued through the years. Subject still corresponds with and occasionally sees Mrs. Kennedy's mother, now Mrs. Hugh D. Auchincloss.

When subject and a former wife organized the National Foundation for Cystic Fibrosis in Dallas, Jacqueline Kennedy was the honorary chairman. The foundation was organized because of the affliction of subject's son, Sergie, who died from cystic fibrosis in 1960.
