FANNIE DULANEY, 3555 Rosedale, who requested that her name be maintained in confidence, advised on May 15, 1963, that she is the owner of property at 6620 Thackeray where GEORGE de MOHREN-SCHILDT and his current wife resided prior to their moving to the 6628 Dickens address. MRS. DULANEY states that while living in her home that the house was maintained in a "filthy atmosphere" and that they seemed to be traveling all the time. She recalled that MR. de MOHRENSCHILDT's daughter, ALEXANDRA, by a previous marriage. had come to live with them during the late summer or early fall in 1959 and that the daughter, ALEXANDRA, had enrolled at Highland Park High School. She only remained approximately six weeks however. While her father and stepmother were away on one of their frequent trips this youngster, who was then about sixteen, ran off with a boy who apparently she had known previously, possibly while he was in military service, and they got married much to the chagrin of the do MOHREN-SCHILDTS who discovered this upon their return. At that time his daughter, ALEXANDRA, and his wife's daughter by a previous marriage, had been left alone in the house.

MRS. DULANEY recalls seeing MR. and MRS. do MOHRENSCHILDT passing by her home frequently while they proceeded in their scantily clad tennis uniforms to play tennis in the nearby park. When asked if she considered them proper persons to take care of a child requiring constant medical attention, she replied, emphatically in the negative.

ADDISON P. MOORE, 1604 Tower Petroleum Building, who requested his identity remain confidential, advised on May 15, 1963, that he and his wife knew GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT while married to WYNNE SHARPLESS, whose father owned Sharpless Oil Company of Midland, Texas, and visited frequently in their home off Hillcrest. He recalled that on one occasion GEORGE exhibited a movie of a trip he had made to Mexico with HENRY ROGATS, geologist, who offices in the First National Bank, Dallas, and lives on Wildwood, which included scenes of ROGATS and himself dancing maked around a car in which a Mexican prostitute was seated naked in an extremely lewed position.
