

that the de MOHRENSCHILDTs live a different type life from what she does and that they like to entertain various types of people, both upper and lower social level, and that they appear to be extremely highly educated--speaking several different languages. She stated that they take care of their two dogs as though they were children. She has observed, however, that MRS. de MOHRENSCHILDT is not a careful housekeeper, that she frequently leaves dishes in the sink for extended periods of time but is the type of person who can prepare a meal amid such disorder without concern or difficulty.

MRS. FOX said that she has observed no excessive drinking or wild parties and that the de MOHRENSCHILDTs have not disturbed her with the type of company they entertain. When asked if she considered them the proper type of people to take care of a sick child, MRS. FOX was somewhat reticent in reply.

MR. PAUL RAIGORODSKY, a person of Russian extraction who maintains an office in the First National Bank Building and resides at the Stoneleigh Hotel, states he has known GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT for several years and sponsored his membership in the Petroleum Club in Dallas; states de MOHRENSCHILDT has no fixed, regular income--merely works on a consulting basis as a petroleum engineer--maintains no office. He has borrowed money from RAIGORODSKY on frequent occasion, generally has repaid it. RAIGORODSKY considers him a Bohemian type individual that he thinks has now "stopped playing around with women and the International set." He doesn't know him now to drink to excess or gamble -- he is a wanderer.

RAIGORODSKY states that within the past year or so he (de MOHRENSCHILDT) and his wife took a walking trip through Mexico to Panama utilizing a donkey and taking one of their dogs with them, which trip incidentally was given publicity in one of the Dallas papers. He states that within the past two months de MOHRENSCHILDT advised he was planning to move to Haiti for a year or so and go into the hemp business and also do some oil development. de MOHRENSCHILDT exhibited letters from Duvalier, head of the present government in Haiti, which were cordial in nature. de MOHRENSCHILDT asked RAIGORODSKY to put some money in the ventures. RAIGORODSKY declined.

RAIGORODSKY described de MOHRENSCHILDT as being approximately forty-four to forty-seven years of age; possibly born in Sweden, his parents were pre-Baltic Germans; that he had come to the United States possibly from Mexico; he is about 6' to 6' 1" tall; weighs over 200 pounds; has brown hair streaked with grey; ruddy complexion; has a brother who is a professor of Russian studies at Dartmouth University; claims to have attended school in Belgium and to have received a Masters Degree from the University of Texas, possibly in geology, in about 1949; no known military service; no known criminal record, according to RAIGORODSKY.
