Link Between Deaths of JFK, King Claimed

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A private committee which says it was formed to "investigate assassinations" contends it has found a link between the slayings of President John F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Bernard Fensterwald Jr., one of two staff members working for the committee, told a news

conference Monday the alleged link is a picture of a man in Dallas an hour after Kennedy was shot.

The photograph is a blown-up shot of a man supposedly being arrested in Dealey Plaza in Dallas. Fensterwald exhibited the photograph and said the man pictured strongly resembled a police sketch made in Memphis from accounts of eyewitnesses to the King assassination.

He suggested the man in the Dallas picture may be the "real" assassin of King.

Fensterwald, former counsel for the Senate Judiciary subcommittee on administrative practices, also claimed he had a

"whole raft of information" that there were at least two persons involved in the Nov. 22, 1963 Kennedy assassination.

A member of the committee, Richard Sprague of Hartsdale, N.Y., said testimony to the Warren Commission supports the contention that three men were arrested an hour after the Kennedy assassination. He said a Dallas policeman testified he ar-

rested three "winos" in the railroad yards behind the area where Kennedy was shot.

Fensterwald said there was never another mention of the arrested men or a record of their arrest in Dallas.
