This is a statement of facts relating to my activity as a Reservo Off Sunday, November 24, 1963, to the best of my knowledge and recollecti

- 1. Approximate time I reported to duty. 9:30 A. M.
- 2. I reported to Capt. Armett.
- 3. I arrived at the City Hall about 9:30 A. M., Sunday morning. I alin the Assembly Room about 9:40 A. M. and reported to Capt. Armet had just checked in when Sgt. Dean, Dallas Folice Department, came asked all Reserve Officers to help search the parking area in the of the City Hall. I personally searched all air conditioning duct heating ducts, above all pipes that run just under the ceiling in basement. I also checked the open space under north ramp. I—seas several cars. They all belonged to the City of Dallas.

I reported to Capt. Arnett, Folice Reserve, and Sgt. Dean, Dallas Department, where I had searched and found clear. I was ordered the by for further assignment. At approximately 10:40 A. M., I was on by Lt. Fen McCoy to check the condition on Commerce Street in reginumber of Police Reserves to hardle sightseers and traffic. I remon Commerce Street as the Reserve Supervisor in charge of the Rese Officers on Commerce Street, 2000 block.

At approximately 11:00, Police Chief Batchelor's car was brought of the bacement to the officer double parked just east of ramp exit. was told by the officer that this was the Chief's car, that he left keys in it and wanted me to keep an eye on it! I placed a Reserve it to work traffic around it. I was told a few minutes later by (Batchelor that an armored truck was on the way to the City Hall. said the truck would have to back down the exit ramp. I was asked assist the armored truck to back down ramp. The truck arrived, two Reserve Officers and myself worked traffic to help truck driver backman ramp. A second armored truck was parked just ahead of the Crar. I was working Commerce Street when the shot was fired in the basement. A detective came running out of the basement and said the doors leading into City Hall. I had one man on Commerce Street two men on Harwood Street door, one man on Main Street door.

These were my movements from 9:35 A. M. to 11:45 A. M., Sunday mor November 24, 1963.
