This man appears to be wholly devoid of any imaginative facilities. His percepts are predominantly the most common. His range of interest and achievements is quite limited, seen in his very narrow associational content. He takes little note of rare and unusual stimuli in his enveronment. His mental functioning is highly stereotyped. In conformity, he is within the limits of the average in that his thinking confeepends with that of the community at large. However, he proceeds cocasionally with alogical reactions.

His grip on reality is below the average. Errors of judgment may be expected.

On two occasions he resorted to edging while handling the cards., This is a very unhealthy sign.

Only a single overt expression of feeling is revealed. This, however, is at the stable level and gives a slight indication of warm social contact.
