Gentlemen: I am a retired guard here at Waupun. I took care of John Schrank who shot Theodore Roosevelt in 1912.


Because of my long record as an officer at the Central State Hospital for the insane and I also worked as a guard at the Wisconsin State Prison (during the riot) and because I am a reliable citizen I feel that I would make a good juror.

Of course both sides would have to sanction their approval. But I am very thoughtful and considerate and hold no malice in my heart. Neither have I formed an opinion of my own.

I can give you the best of recommendations from bankers, (The National Bank of Waupun) lawyers and the sheriff's office of Dodge county and maybe you could look me up with the FBI. I think they would give me a recommendation but I seldom refer to them because they are so busy and secretive. I believe I am one of the most fair and unbiased men you could have for the Ruby trial.
