Dear Sir:

When the unfortunate incidents of the 22nd and 24th of November occurred, I must admit that I too was enraged and horrified, and was inclined to blame ineffective local security measures for the tragedies resulting in the violent deaths of three fellow Americans. Since then I have come to my senses and want to remedy my suspicions, which were grounded on sheer ignorance of the situation, with insight.

This may seem irregular, and in truth, I do not know if it is possible, but I would like to have a transcript of the trial of Jack Ruby when the case reaches the courts, and would sincerely appreciate learning all I can about the investigation of Lee Oswald. If necessary, I will send enough postage to cover the cost of mailing the material. I want to accept responsibility in my government, the responsibility of knowing before forming a judgment; I feel this is the only possible way I can accomplish it. Thank you for any information you may be able to send me.
