

being not a conspiracy in the assassination," the committee said.

"The committee developed new information about Oswald and Ruby, thus altering previous perceptions, but the assassin and the man who murdered him still appear against a backdrop of unexplained, or at least not fully explained, occurrences, associations and motivations."

The committee found Ruby's relationship with the Dallas Police Department "somewhat unusual," but there was no evidence officers allowed him to engage in unlawful activities.

The committee said, however, evidence shows Ruby entered the police basement through an alley and a stairway — and not the northside ramp — and it was unlikely he entered without assistance. The committee said the assistance may have been without knowledge of Ruby's intention to shoot Oswald.
