The New Orleans district attorney said:

"We are particularly interested in clarifying now what is also coded in Lee Oswald's address book the New Orleans) phone number of the Central Intelligence Agency," Garrison said.

HE CLAIMED he had been in New Orleans for some time and was working with the Dallas during the same time Oswald was working for the CIA in New Orleans. This means that the CIA knew that these two men (Clay Shaw and Oswald) knew each other," Garrison said.

He claimed he also has information that Oswald was not a CIA agent who was working in New Orleans.

The CIA telephone number, Garrison said, was found in the front of Oswald's address book. "Since it is obvious that it is no longer possible to get the truth in any form from officials of the CIA in Washington, no further investigation is warranted."
