Judge Blocks Author Move to Aid Shaw

ORLEANS, La. (UPI)—

Edward A. Haggerty Jr.

blocked Saturday Evening

Author James Phelan from

giving defense testimony

in Clay L. Shaw's trial

of conspiring to assassinate

President John Kennedy.

The attorneys wanted

to be permitted

to file a material deposition

of Atty. Jim Garrison's

witnesses against Shaw had

been granted and provided

while the defense had been

unable to file a deposition

of assassin Lee Harvey

Oswald.

The witness, Perry Raymond

Brown, 23, of Baton Rouge,

La., testified March that he attended

the funeral in mid-September 1963

of Lee Harvey Oswald and the late Dr.

W. J. LeMoyne, who was believed

to be about to assassinate Kennedy

on Nov. 22, 1963.

He said he had been asked by

Garrison's office to file a deposition

of his testimony and had agreed

to do so, but the Orleans grand jury

had refused to accept it.

He was asked to give testimony on be-

half of the defense in the

trial of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Shaw's motion "isn't even close" to Louisiana statutes, he said.

In another development,

New Orleans grand jury

subpoenaed for May 10 a

salesman who told the

Lee Harvey Oswald may have

been in New Orleans and

Dallas two weeks before

Kennedy was assassinated.

The Warren Commission

Oswald left New Orleans Sept.

23, 1963, and reached

Dallas April 26, 1964, calling himself "Oswald".

He was killed Nov. 22, 1963

in Dallas.

Attorney G. Wray Gill

of Dallas said he attached no importance

to the question the man who

was seen in New Orleans

on behalf of the "friends of Cuban

revolutionaries" was

not Oswald.
