

Witness To Tell Of Seeing Oswald

NEW ORLEANS (UPI)

to testify before the New Orleans
grand jury.

The grand jury subpoenaed
Ray W. Dealatte Tuesday
after Dealatte had

whom he knew from
Dallas was called "Oswald,"
approached him two weeks
before the assassination and
asked about the prices of trucks.

Tuesday.

Following that
a grand jury subpoena
was issued Tuesday. Dealatte
was subpoenaed May 10, when the
grand jury convened.

Dealatte, 29, was to appear in
federal court for a hearing
on the first fugitive
warrant charging him with conspiracy
in the assassination of
President Kennedy.
