

# GARRISON MOVES to Get Witnesses

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP) — U.S. Atty. Jim Garrison moved today to get witnesses he wants in his John F. Kennedy assassination conspiracy probe.

Garrison's district attorney's office issued a warrant Monday for the arrest of Lilly Mae McMaines, 22, Omaha, Neb. as a material witness.

The U.S. attorney's office was authorized by Garrison to issue an arrest warrant and flight order against Novel, 29, former owner of the French Quarter bar who appeared last week before he was to have appeared before the Orleans Parish grand jury.

ment of the late David Rusk in mid-September 1963. After this party, Rusk testified two weeks ago, he believed Ferris, Oswald and Clay Shaw conspire to kill President Kennedy.

Shaw, 54, a retired New Orleans business executive, has been indicted by the grand jury on a charge of conspiracy to murder Kennedy.

ordered by President Johnson to investigate the assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas, Nov. 22, 1963, concluded that New Orleans-born Lee Harvey Oswald was the assassin and acted alone.

Garrison's office issued a warrant last week for Novel's arrest and asked that he be released under \$50,000 bond.
