RE: GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT

MRS. JOSH H. MAYO, 3101 University, who with her husband, owns the property at 6628 Dickens where GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT and his wife now reside, stated that the de MOHRENSCHILDTs have resided at the Dickens address since October 5, 1961, in the upper left apartment of a two-story brick building. Their apartment consists of a living room and dining room combined, one large bedroom and one small bedroom which is now utilized as a dining room. The house is generally ill kept, the beds are practically on the floor, and maintained in keeping with their Oriental or beatnik type of life. They owed her five months rent but paid two months of the delinquency on February 8, 1963. They still are three months in arrears. The rent is \$115.00 per month. In May, 1962, they gave her an NSF check for the rent which was subsequently made good.

Sometime within recent months, MRS. de MOHRENSCHILDT's daughter and husband from San Diego came and stayed with the de MOHRENSCHILDTs for several weeks. The daughter and the husband are beatniks; the husband wore a Castro type beard, wore dark pants with slits in the knees, etc.

The de MOHRENSCHILDTs maintain two Chihuahua dogs which have succeeded in ruining practically all of the carpet in the apartment.

When asked if the de MOHRENSCHILDTs were the type of people that she would like to have keep her grandchild for her she replied, "positively not."

MR. JOSE MAYO states he normally takes care of the apartment at 6628 Dickens, that he sees the de MOHRENSCHILDTs there frequently. MR. de MOHRENSCHILDT is normally dressed only in shorts, wanders about in them. MRS. de MOHRENSCHILDT normally wears a bunny type bikini and seems to shower her affection on their two Chihuahua dogs.

MR. MAYO stated that he knew that de MOHRENSCHILDT had been represented in Dallas legally by MORRIS JAFFEE of the firm of Wynne and Wynne.

MR. de MOHRENSCHILDT does not appear to have any regular type employment but generally spends his time telling of the big deals he has pending despite the fact that he is always in arrears in the rent. When asked if he considered them the proper type people to take care of a sick child he replied, "I wouldn't want them taking care of my grandchild."
