SUBJECT: ORIGINAL INTELLIGENCE SECTION
PREPARATION FOR THE VISIT OF
JOHN F. KENNEDY TO DALLAS ON
NOVEMBER 22, 1963

Sir:

On November 18, 1963, the U.S. SAC AT DALLAS advised the DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT that MR. JOHN F. KENNEDY, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES would visit DALLAS on November 22, 1963. MR. KENNEDY was scheduled to speak at a luncheon sponsored by the DALLAS CITIZEN'S COUNCIL. This luncheon was to be at the DALLAS TRADE MART located on J. J. DALLAS PARKWAY at INDUSTRIAL BLVD.

Prior to this announcement, there had been numerous rumors that MR. KENNEDY would visit DALLAS. Because of these rumors, the Criminal Intelligence Section had increased its efforts in attempting to gather data concerning known extremist and subversive groups in DALLAS. This section had previously been successful in infiltrating a number of these organizations; therefore the activities, capabilities, personalities and future plans of these groups were known.

Members of the Criminal Intelligence Section frequently kept known members of these groups under surveillance to determine associations and movements.
