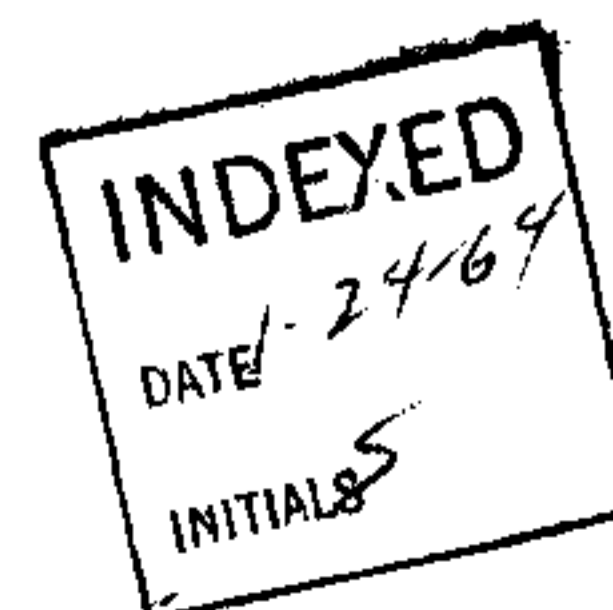

On February 12, 1963, JACK LEON RUBY was arrested at the Burgundy Room of the Adolphus Hotel and charged in City Court, with simple assault on one DONALD ROT TABON. On this charge, the SUBJECT was listed as a witness. The arresting officer had listed the SUBJECT as N. T. STINSON. The SUBJECT was interviewed on 1-8-64 and stated that he had been in the Burgundy Room on the night the incident occurred. That he observed the finish of the incident. He stated that he could say that one of the participants was bruised and bloody but that he could not identify either principal. He stated that after the officer had come to the scene and all parties had departed, some one told him that the man that had beaten the victim was the 'bouncer' at the Carousel Club. The SUBJECT stated that there was nothing else he could tell about this incident and that although he now knows that one of the men was JACK RUBY, he did not know the man at that time. He did not know why the fight started.
