Mr. Joneshill said, "We intend to examine prospective jurors' conscious, subconscious, and unconscious thoughts." There is no such a thing as <sup>an</sup> unconscious thought. The concept is self-contradictory. The Psychological concept of the unconscious mind is repugnant to the Word of God in the Bible. There ~~may~~ <sup>is</sup> be such a thing as the subconscious; but it ~~more~~ is never essentially different from the conscious, but is only a lesser degree of consciousness. It is what St. Paul was talking about when he said, "In this earthly life, we oftentimes see through a glass darkly." The subconscious is what we know deep
