SUBJECT: CRIMINAL INTELLIGENCE (6)

Sir:

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. GANNAWAY, SUBJECT was interviewed by the undersigned officer and the following report submitted.

SUBJECT operates a PHILLIPS 66 service station at 3000 Blackburn, LAL-7131. He has been in business at this location for approximately two years and prior to this he was in the insurance business. SUBJECT resides at 1859 Greendale, EX8-7474.

SUBJECT stated that he met JACK RUBY in 1947 or 1948 when RUBY opened the SILVER SPUR CLUB on South Ervay. His only association with him was as a patron to that establishment. SUBJECT said that the last time he saw RUBY was at a bank, approximately ten weeks before the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. At that time they exchanged business cards. RUBY invited him to his CAROUSEL CLUB, but SUBJECT did not go. To him, RUBY appeared to be the nervous type that would fight "at the drop of a hat". SUBJECT did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD, nor did he know of any association between RUBY and OSWALD.
