SUBJECT: Ruby's Reputation for and Acts of Violence

An examination of the Jack Ruby investigative reports was made to determine the identity of persons who could testify regarding Ruby's reputation for not being peaceful and law abiding; and persons who have first hand knowledge of acts of violence committed by Ruby. The results are as follows. All page numbers refer to "JACK RUBY INVESTIGATIONS," copy no. 3.

32. BROWN, Judy - P. 332 - While employed by Ruby Sound
1028 E. Colfax Ave. him to be highly emotional
Denver, Colorado very impulsive and quick-tempered.
33. CALHOUN, Henry Red - P. 333 - In 1954 Ruby struck him in
4906 Linnet Lane mouth and 16 stitches required;
Dallas, Texas when Ruby loses temper, he has
no control over himself.
34. DICKERSON, Willis D. - P. 334 - Ruby struck him in face and
2442 Hawthorne St. knuckled him in the groin. He
Dallas, Texas bit Ruby's finger and nearly
severed it; Ruby had tip of
finger amputated.
35. SHARD, Joey - P. 351 - Ruby given to fits of temper in
Room 432 Baltimore Hotel dealings with employees.
36. HARDY, Jack, Jr. - P. 345 - Pursuant to argument over girl,
County Jail (in Federal custody) Ruby pulled .357 magnum revolver
Mobile, Alabama from waistband of his trousers;
Ruby impressed him as one who
would kill without much provocation.
