SUBJECT: Ruby's Reputation for and Acts of Violence

An examination of the Jack Ruby investigative reports was made to determine the identity of persons who could testify regarding Ruby's reputation for not being peaceful and law abiding; and persons who have first hand knowledge of acts of violence committed by Ruby. 32. BROWN, Judy - P. 332 -
1028 E. Colfax Ave.
Denver, Colorado

While employed by Ruby found him to be highly emotional very impulsive and quick-tempered.

33. CALHOUN, Henry Red - P. 333 -
4906 Linnet Lane
Dallas, Texas

In 1954 Ruby struck him in mouth and 16 stitches required; when Ruby loses temper, he has no control over himself.

34. DICKERSON, Willis D. - P. 334 -
2442 Hawthorne St.
Dallas, Texas

Ruby struck him in face and kneeed him in the groin. He bit Ruby's finger and nearly severed it; Ruby had tip of finger amputated.

35. GHARD, Joey - P. 351 -
Room 432 Baltimore Hotel

Ruby given to fits of temper in dealings with employees.

36. HARRY, Jack, Jr. - P. 345 -
County Jail (in federal custody)
Mobile, Alabama

Pursuant to argument over girl, Ruby pulled .357 magnum revolver from waistband of his trousers; Ruby impressed him as one who would kill without much provocation.
