

'The charge of the court virtually put the evidence of these doctors and professors upon a higher plane than the other testimony, which was manifestly wrong.'

* * *

"In People -v- Holmes, 111 Mich. 364 (69 N.W. 501), we said:

'When the question of insanity is to be submitted to the jury, the testimony which is offered to support the claim should be treated with the same respect as that offered to establish any other fact.'

" *** That both professions recognize and deplore the existence of the evil, there can be no doubt, and recent activities in both lend reason for hoping that the scandal which has often attended the introduction of expert testimony will, in the future, cease to be a reproach in the administration of criminal law." People -v- Dickerson, 164 Mich. 148, pages 154, 155.

"The constitutional guaranty that no person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property, without due process of law, preserves to the people rights which were enjoyed under the common law, and guarantees such exercise of governmental power as is sanctioned by settled maxims of law, under such safeguards for the protection of individual rights as those maxims prescribe. People -v- Dickerson, supra.

Ruby would be deprived of his constitutional and civil rights if the doctors selected by the prosecutor and Court are permitted to treat Ruby. Such selection would violate the confidential relationship between physician and patient. It could lead to a further miscarriage of justice in this case.

Serious consideration should be given to the filing of a petition for writ of 'habeas corpus' in the Federal Court because Ruby was denied 'due process' and was denied a fair trial and was convicted as a result of prejudice. The Supreme Court of the U.S. held in the case of Leo Frank that Federal Courts have the right to intervene when a defendant did not receive a fair trial. This was an appeal from the Georgia Supreme Court. Similar cases involving the same issue in other countries like the case of Mendle Bayless in Russia and the famous case of Capt. Dreyfuss in France, should be examined.

Even though such a motion for reconsideration may be summarily rejected by Judge Brown, it nevertheless should be made so that a proper foundation will be in the record for arguments concerning all the questions herein, before the Supreme Court of Texas, and before United States Supreme Court, in case new trial is denied.

The inability of a client suffering a mental condition to communicate such evidence to his attorney by reason of his mental condition is grounds for labelling such evidence "newly discovered."

It would be helpful if the petition for re-consideration could also have attached to it the affidavits of those psychiatrists who previously limited their examination and testimony to the organic psychomotor epileptic condition.

3) Although there is an indication that Ruby may be given needed medical attention in order to prevent his mental condition from becoming worse or incurably insane or to prevent him from committing suicide. The psychiatrists chosen to treat Ruby should be outstanding forensic psychiatrists like Dr. Tanay.

Nevertheless a formal petition should be filed and made part of the record showing this mental condition and requesting such treatment so that this, too, will be in the record for use before the Supreme Court of Texas, or U. S. Supreme Court.

4) Despite the recent indication that Jack Ruby will receive a sanity hearing, it is of utmost importance that a proper and complete formal petition for same be filed with the affidavits referred to attached, showing why this "newly discovered" evidence was not previously available, to plug the loopholes, and protect the record for review by the Supreme Court of Texas and U. S. Supreme Court, of any "Abuse of Discretion."

5) If either suggestions 3 or 4 are denied, application should be made immediately to Federal Court to protect Ruby's civil rights.

6) Attempts should be made to interest the American Psychiatric Society in this case, for the purpose of having them appoint a special panel of psychiatrists to impartially examine Ruby and submit their report. (Vis a vis the actions and effect formerly of the Epilepsy Society that may have been planned by those seeking Ruby's conviction).

7) Attempts should be made to interest the American Bar Assn. and Texas Bar in this case, for them to possibly appear amicus curiae or via "of counsel" and file briefs concerning the legal issues involved. (These need not be 'criminal' lawyers).

This historic case deserves to be fully prepared and presented, at least to the Supreme Court, to prevent any future regrets or criticisms for not having covered all possible areas.

By the following procedures outlined, supported by verified petitions with full disclosure, spelling out the facts upon which they are based, they will not only show that Ruby was unable to 'assist his counsel' before and during the trial, but such petitions will establish that Ruby did not receive a fair trial, and that he was insane for a long time prior to, as well as at the time of the shooting of Oswald. It will at least show that the verdict was a result of prejudice, and hate and contrary to even the limited evidence, in view of the doctrine of presumed innocence and reasonable doubt.

Such petitions would also establish that the shooting of Oswald was at least an unpremeditated act of Ruby's deranged mind, and that he is at least entitled to a fair new trial.

Dear Mr. Chief Justice:

In response to your letter of June 11, 1964, I would like to assure you that all information relating in any way to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in the possession of the Department of Justice has been referred to the President's Commission for appropriate review and investigation.

As you know, I am personally not aware of the detailed results of the extensive investigation in this matter which has been conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have, however, received periodic reports about the work of the Commission from you, Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach and Mr. Willens of the Department of Justice, who has worked with the Commission for the past several months. Based on these reports, I am confident that every effort is being made by the President's Commission to fulfill the objectives of Executive Order No. 11130 by conducting a thorough investigation into all the facts relating to the assassination.

In response to your specific inquiry, I would like to state definitely that I know of no credible evidence to support the allegations that the assassination of President Kennedy was caused by a domestic or foreign conspiracy. I have no suggestions to make at this time regarding any additional investigation which should be undertaken by the Commission prior to the publication of its report. In the event that the members of the Commission believe that I can contribute in any way to the investigation by appearing as a witness, I will be available to do so at your convenience.

Dear Hobart:

I recently became legal advisor to the Ruby family when they insisted that their brother, Jack Ruby, did not receive a fair and impartial trial because of the vicious attitude in Dallas, towards Catholics, Jews, and Negroes. My investigation confirms this. These issues of basic justice and deprivation of civil rights far exceed the Ruby case.

I am therefore turning to you for assistance in obtaining the information concerning the items set forth on page 25 of the enclosed Memorandum Brief.

This information would inure to the benefit of the Warren Commission as well as my primary objective, which is the protection of civil liberties of all, not excluding those of Jack Ruby. It might be that the Warren Commission has made some inquiry along these lines to determine whether the Klu Klux Klan or the John Birch Society had any connection with Oswald or the President's assassination.

I would therefore like your help in determining whether the Judge, the four prosecutors, any of the jurors, and the witnesses for the prosecution are listed as members of the K. K. K. or the Birch Society.

When I was in Texas, I took a photograph of a billboard that is still there, reading, "Save the Republic--Impeach Warren". This sign is constructed on the premises of the Earl Thorton Electric Company, 2317 Esst 11th Street, in Dallas. This, and larger billboards, were constructed before the President was assassinated.

It would also be interesting to find out who constructed that sign and any connection between the owners of the Thorton Electric Company and these hate groups.

This information is very important for us to obtain. as quickly as possible, sothat we can incorporate it into proceedings we intend taking either before Judge Brown or before the Supreme Court.

I would therefore appreciate if you would give this matter your very prompt attention.

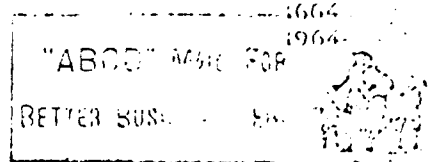

One can only wish that the Warren Commission -- named to investigate the assassination of President Kennedy -- had as much gumption and good judgment as Norman Redlich has gall.

Redlich is a professor of law at New York University. Since December 20 of last year he has been a \$100-a-day legal consultant to the Warren Commission. Meanwhile he has continued to lend his name and support to Communist front groups -- a practice he began nine years ago.

Redlich has maintained his membership on the National Council (the governing body) of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee -- identified by two Congressional committees and FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover as a Communist front.

His name appeared on an April 13, 1964 New York Times advertisement, lauding the work of the ECLC and soliciting funds for its support. (Formation of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee -- not to be confused with the American Civil Liberties Union -- was announced in October, 1951 by the Communist Daily Worker. It serves, among other things, as a propaganda and legal defense arm for Communists.)

Redlich's name also appears on ads published in the December 21, 1963 Nation and the February, 1964 Frontier. These ads solicit funds for legal defense of three youths indicted by a Federal Grand Jury last September for illegal travel to Cuba as guests of Castro's government and for "conspiring illegally to organize and promote a trip to Cuba in violation of U.S. travel laws."

(Early last year this man Redlich, who is now "helping" the Warren Commission investigate the assassination of President Kennedy -- by a self-styled Marxist, three-year defector to Soviet Russia, and member of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee -- joined in a statement protesting hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities on violations of State Department travel regulations and pro-Castro propaganda activities in the United States.)

Also since joining the Warren Commission staff, Redlich's name was carried in the February 21, 1964 Abolition News, the bulletin of the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee, as one of the organization's sponsors. Seven of the 13 top leaders of this organization are identified Communists.

Because the Warren Commission has followed a "hire first, investigate later" policy, it wasn't until last week that it got around to reviewing the report on an investigation of Redlich. And the Commission then cleared him for the duties he has been carrying on since December 20 -- including access to classified material.

The Commission cleared Redlich on the grounds that there was no evidence of actual Communist Party membership. Standard government security criteria include many other disqualifying factors -- among them "unsuitability and pressure risk" and "sympathetic association with subversive individuals or groups."

The Commission, incidentally, rejected a motion by Congressman Gerald R. Ford of Michigan -- one of its members -- to terminate Redlich's employment.

Last February the Commission chairman, Chief Justice Warren, told reporters that "because of security precautions, some of the testimony might not be released to the public within their lifetimes."

The Commission's laxity in the Redlich matter makes a mockery of "security precautions."

At the time of the Warren statement, I warned in a House speech that "public confidence is a very fragile thing."

By its hiring and retaining Norman Redlich, the Commission has shown about as much concern for public confidence as a clumsy and careless baggageman does for the "handle with care" labels.

Blundering is not treason, by any stretch of the imagination. But it can be just as fatal -- both to public confidence and to national security.

Dear Mr. Kennedy:

One of my hobbies is world-wide stamp collecting to this effect I am in contact with foreign collectors on countries who I exchange stamps with.

Some months ago, one of my exchange partners in Czechoslovakia sent me a stamp-letter in which also was a clipping of a Czechoslovakian newspaper.

In his letter, he explained that this article appeared in one of the Czechoslovakian papers some time AFTER the assassination of President Kennedy.

This shocking clipping showed the picture of President Kennedy - front and profile - and below was printed in capital letters:

'This man is wanted for treason!'

Next to the picture were enumerated the points why he is in short, it was like a rogues gallery picture.

Since it was printed in Czech - with the exception of 'It is wanted for treason' which was printed in English - my correspondent tried to translate for me some of the points enumerated next to the picture.

Even he, a native and resident of a communist country voiced his deep concern and regret over this shocking exposure late beloved President and apologized for sending me this clipping.

This article the clipping shows is supposed to be a reproduction of the original leaflet printed and distributed by some secret organization in US - long before President Kennedy announced his intention to run for President in Dallas, Texas.

Now this leaflet supposedly originated in US came into the hands of that newspaper in Czechoslovakia - before or after the assassination of President Kennedy remains unknown. It can be assumed that a reporter or diplomat of one of the communist countries stationed in US - somehow got hold of the original and later - after the assassination of President Kennedy - made it available to that particular newspaper which then copied and produced it.

It is hardly conceivable that any responsible paper of even a communist country would dare printing such an offensive and shocking matter which might entail farflung international repercussion without having substantial proof at hand - meaning the original.

We were so grieved and shocked over it that at first I didn't know what to do with it.

Finally I decided to write to the Daily News about it and asked for advice.

I received the following reply :

" Dear Sir:

The subject on which you have written has come to our attention before in several forms.

It is only proper that you make your information available to Senator Kenneth Keating since such an inquiry could involve the higher echelons of government, where we do not have access.

Thanking you for your interest, sincerely,"

I followed this advice and mailed a letter with the enclosed clipping to Senator Kenneth Keating.

I received a reply from him, dated April 24, 1964 with the following contents:

Dear [REDACTED]

Thank you for your recent letter and the enclosed clipping from a Czechoslovakian publication with reference to the late President Kennedy.

I appreciate your sending it to me. It is a shocking story which I have called to the attention of the Commission now investigating the assassination of President Kennedy.

As for this shocking clipping, many questions, of course, arise now in one's mind - such as :

- Did our Embassy in Prague know about this article and reproduction of the original presumed to have been printed and distributed in US ?
- Has our State Department been informed about it - and if so, why have these facts been withheld from the American people ?
- Who or what secret organization was behind it ?
- Could the murder of the assassin been a prearranged matter in order to silence him ?

As of now, we see nothing mentioned about this in the preliminary report of the Commission.

We wish, Mr. Kennedy, you would try to see this horrible clipping for yourself which presently rests with the Commission.

We can find no words that could adequately express our deep concern and indignation about this matter and we wish to see the memory of our beloved President Kennedy vindicated.

We beseech you and trust you will do everything in your power to have the parties responsible for this infamous publication and betrayal of our late President whose memory we cherish apprehended and exposed.

Please accept our profound apology for bringing this disturbing matter to your kind attention.

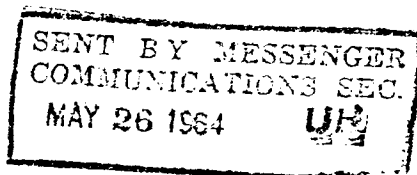
This refers to your letter of May 13, 1964, to me with which you enclosed a letter from [REDACTED]

I have conferred with the Criminal Division of the Department concerning the several questions raised by [REDACTED] and I am advised that a thorough search of all files of the Department fails to lend any credence to the allegation to the fact that any officer of this Department ever requested the Dallas Police Department to refrain from taking any action in connection with the alleged attempted slaying of General Walker.

The other questions raised by [REDACTED] relate to matters now before the Special Commission appointed by President Johnson to investigate the assassination of President Kennedy. All of the information from federal investigative agencies relating to the assassination of President Kennedy and to any events subsequent to the assassination has been forwarded to the Special Commission for its consideration and evaluation in connection with the forthcoming report of the Commission.

As to the fiscal allegation which [REDACTED] has made regarding an allegation that some facts may be suppressed for a long time to come in connection with the investigation of President Kennedy's assassination, the following statement by Chief Justice Warren is pertinent:
