Inspector J. R. MALLEY telephonically advised 11:15 AM, 4/2/64, that the Bureau is in receipt of a letter from the Commission advising that a member of the Commission, Mr. SAMUAL A. STERN, a member of the staff, is to proceed to Dallas to obtain affidavits from federal law enforcement officials and members of the FBI who were present or have knowledge of the arrest and incarceration of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. This request specifically named and asked permission to interview SA'S MANNING C. CLEMENTS and JAMES W. BOOKHOUT. Request was that they be made available at the office of the U. S. Attorney on April 8 or 9, 1964. The request continued that, if interview of these Agents is approved, Mr. STERN will contact the SAC, Dallas, on his arrival to arrange for a definite time.

Included in this request was the statement, "If these interviews develop the names of other employees, I trust that it will be permissible for Mr. STERN to arrange appropriate interviews through the SAC."

Mr. MALLEY advised that a memorandum is being prepared to the Commission advising that SA'S CLEMENTS and BOOKHOUT will be made available for the desired interview. Mr. MALLEY advised that a copy of the request and the authorization will be made available to Dallas.

Mr. MALLEY instructed that these Agents and all Agents of the Dallas Office are to be reminded that they should furnish information concerning facts that they know regarding the arrest or detention, and only facts which have been reduced to writing and included in report form. Under no circumstances are any of the Agents to furnish their personal opinions or views. All answers given are to be based on what has been reported in connection with interviews conducted by them.

In the event Mr. STERN requests that additional Agents be made available for interview, at the time of the request it should be determined the identity of the Agent, the reason for the interview, and if Mr. STERN is attempting to obtain a personal opinion of the Agent. In the event such a request is received, he should be tactfully advised that the Agents report factually all information they receive and they have no personal opinion or observation. If such a request is received of an Agent, he should reply that he can only furnish information which has been previously reported. He should also state that he has no personal opinion or feeling concerning the information developed and it was reported factually and impartial in line with the investigation. If he is questioned as to why he interviewed a certain person or why he attempted to obtain certain information, this answer should be that he had done so on instructions of the SAC, ASAC or Supervisor concerned, and he was purely interviewing the individual to obtain the information available that would have bearing on the investigation.

SAC EVALUATION:

Paragraph 3, Page 3, of referenced report is less than a literary epic. The poor wording requires rereading and rereading to assure clarity. Consequently, it has been revised.

Paragraph 3 on Page 6 of SA CHAPMAN's report was his feeble effort to furnish background data to facilitate comprehension by the reader that Yellow Springs, Ohio, is a rumor-rife college community. What SA CHAPMAN was endeavoring to convey in the needless sentence, Paragraph 3, Page 6, was that the Yellow Springs - Antioch College Area is an uninhibited atmosphere with the utmost of alleged academic, intellectual and personal abandon, and out of such a community rumors spring without foundation.

Newspapers and wire services freely report on the activities of certain Antioch College students who seem to interest themselves in almost all sociological, political or public interest controversy of timely interest. Widespread public knowledge of activities at Antioch axiomatically exist and need no reportorial reiteration. Therefore, I agree with the Bureau as to deletion.

I regret the inconvenience caused the Bureau. Sharp Error Slips have been issued along with emphatic admonitions. Recurrence not likely.

A confidential source abroad advised that on March 26, 1964, HERBERT ROBERT VOORHEES, who was issued Mexican Tourist Card FM-5 #4325846 by the Mexican Immigration Service at Nuevo Laredo, State of Tamaulipas, on June 5, 1963, and entered Mexico at the same place on the same date by train, made the following statement at his present residence, 19 Calle Masones, Apartment 10, San Miguel de Allende, State of Guanajuato, Mexico:

He advised that his true name is HERBERT FRANCIS VOORHEES, but that in some manner or other his name was listed incorrectly as HERBERT ROBERT VOORHEES on his birth certificate. He uses his true name as a commercial cartoonist.

He has lived a greater part of his life, until six years ago in Chicago, Illinois. He lived last in Chicago for twelve years at the Lake Lane Apartment, 6214 Winthrop Street, Chicago, Illinois. He is a widower and for the last six years he has traveled primarily by train to Mexico, where he has located in San Miguel de Allende several friendly Americans and artists.

He explained that he obtains a Mexican Tourist Visa which is good for 180 days stay in Mexico and this causes him to return to the United States about every six months to have his re-entry into Mexico re-established for 180-day periods as tourist.

BASIS FOR INQUIRY

The information set out below was made available by a confidential source abroad.

According to the records of the Department of Immigration, Mexican Ministry of "Gobernacion" (Interior or Government), Mexico, D. F., Mexico, among tourist cards surrendered by "aliens" departing from Mexico at Nuevo Laredo, State of Tamaulipas, as tourists on October 3, 1963, was the tourist card of Herbert Robert VOORHEES. This card was an FM-5 permit bearing No. 4325846. It was valid for 180 days' stay in Mexico. This tourist card was issued by the Mexican Immigration Service in Nuevo Laredo on June 5, 1963, and the following data was recorded thereon:

VOORHEES entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on June 5, 1963, by train with final destination designated as Mexico, D. F. He was described on the tourist card as a male, American citizen; 73 years of age; a widower; retired; born in Beloit, Wisconsin; residence, Overland Park, Kansas. He presented a birth certificate as proof of citizenship. This tourist card carries the typewritten Spanish word "tren" (meaning train), and the Mexican Immigration form FM-11 which constitutes a recapitulation of departures of tourists at Nuevo Laredo on October 3, 1963, records that VOORHEES departed from Mexico by railroad with the final destination of "Overland, P. K." The departure of VOORHEES from Mexico was handled by Mexican Immigration Service employee ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA.

He explained, the train from Nuevo Laredo, State of Tamaulipas, Mexico, does not go to San Miguel de Allende and in his travels he has gotten off of the train at San Luis Potosi, State of San Luis Potosi, Mexico, and traveled to San Miguel de Allende by bus.

He advised that the last time he departed from Mexico was by "Greyhound bus" in the early part of October 1963. He recalled that he had entered Mexico by train some months previous to October 6, 1963, because by this date he had to leave Mexico to renew his tourist visa.

He could not recall the exact date he entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo by train from San Antonio, Texas, where he had proceeded to previously from Kansas City, Kansas, via the "Katy Railroad Line," but he was certain that it was several months previous to October 6, 1963, when his Mexican Tourist Visa would have expired.

He recalled that on or about October 2, 1963, he left San Miguel de Allende at 7:30 AM by a "second class yellow bus" to San Luis Potosi, where he arrived just before noon the same day.

He recalled purchasing a "through ticket" to San Antonio, Texas, via the "Greyhound bus," which he clarified as being the Transportes del Norte bus line at San Luis Potosi.

He remembered that after the purchase of his ticket he had lunch and left San Luis Potosi on the Transportes del Norte bus at about 2:40 PM on October 2, 1963.

He could not recall his ticket number; could not recall if his name was registered on a passenger list, and he did not know if the bus he boarded had proceeded from Mexico, D. F., to San Luis Potosi. He saw the bus drive into the bus station at San Luis Potosi, but he did not recall if passengers were in it.

He remembered that he and other passengers boarded the bus at the Transportes del Norte bus station in San Luis

Potosi and he assumed that the bus was made up at this city because "it smelled clean" when he boarded it, but he was not certain of this.

He did not recall seeing any other American passengers aboard and he could not recall the number of passengers on the bus. He stated that he did not count the passengers and that there were at least four and certainly several more.

He stated that on this trip he went straight to Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, and to Laredo, Texas, arriving there at about 2:00 AM on October 3, 1963. He alone left the bus at Laredo, Texas, and stayed at the Southland Hotel in Laredo to rest and subsequently on the same day took a Greyhound bus, using the same ticket, to San Antonio, Texas.

He responded that the bus did stop at about 1:00 AM on October 3, 1963, at the "Mexican Immigration check station twelve miles from the Mexican-American border" and that the lights in the bus were turned on and the Mexican Immigration Official came aboard to check each passenger's documents.

He recalled clearly that the Mexican Immigration Official took off of the bus a young American man described only as about 20 years of age, 5' 9" tall, not heavy, medium build, bare headed, wore no coat, and carried one small bag and no suitcase.

He could not recall details about the American's description and repeatedly stated that the American was clean-shaven, cleanly dressed, wearing a shirt, slacks and shoes, and that he was "not a beatnik." With regard to the young American's dress, he recalled that he had considered that the American was lightly dressed because he was not wearing a coat during the cool night.

He recalled having sat on the right side of the bus, because he always rides a bus sitting on the right side looking forward. He remembered that he did not sit toward the front or the back and sat somewhere in the middle of the bus.

During the trip he talked with a Mexican-American who spoke English and Spanish well and sat across the aisle from him. The Mexican-American, whom he remembered only as middle-aged and thin faced, advised VOORHEES that he was going to the United States, but he could not recall this destination nor the name of the Mexican-American.

He remembered that the Mexican-American was traveling with his wife on the bus and that he was apparently returning to "his business" in the United States. The Mexican-American was a chain smoker and he appeared to be very nervous, for he smoked one cigarette after another.

During the trip he discussed with the Mexican-American the fact that he was a commercial artist. He did not know if the Mexican-American is a Mexican citizen.

He remembered that when the American was taken off the bus that he was taken from the back of the bus to the front and that the Mexican-American remarked to VOORHEES that the American was having trouble "over his papers."

He recalled that when the American returned to the bus and walked to the back, he mumbled in good English in a grumbling manner something like, "My papers were in order before and I don't know why they bother me now, they took my pass before."

He recalled that when the American was taken off the bus this was the first time that he saw and noticed him. He was certain that the American could not speak Spanish and VOORHEES presumed that the American was taken off the bus to the "check station office" where someone must have spoke to him in English.

He remembered seeing the American again at the United States Customs checking station in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, at about 1:30 AM on October 3, 1963, when a Mexican woman's luggage was being examined and the young American was standing by. He recalled that the American, who was trying to dispose of a banana by eating it, was told by a United States Customs

Officer then that it was all right that he could bring the banana into the United States.

He did not speak to or was near the young American at any time.

He recalled leaving the bus alone at Laredo, Texas, at about 2:00 AM on October 3, 1963, and he considered that the American, as well as the other passengers, stayed on the bus to proceed on to San Antonio, Texas, or other points.

He remembered having arrived at Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico, at about 11:00 PM on October 2, 1963, and that he and the other passengers had to change to a smaller bus to proceed to Nuevo Laredo. He did not remember seeing the young American when this bus change was made and he does not know if this American got on the bus at Monterrey or at some other point.

He considered that other passengers aside from those who traveled from San Luis Potosi boarded the bus at Monterrey, but he was not certain of this.

He stated that he took the bus on this occasion to make for proper train connections in Kansas City, Kansas, and he took a train from San Antonio, Texas, to Kansas City and then proceeded on to visit his daughter, Mrs. NANCY M. TOUHY, 886 West Army Trail Road, Addison, Illinois, 60101, U.S.A.

He always visits his daughter upon his return to the United States and stated that, if necessary, he can be located always through her.

He recalled that the young American did not have a suitcase and had either a small zipper bag or a small duffel bag. He was not certain about the latter.

He did not know whether the young American got off of the bus at Laredo, Texas, and felt certain that he had stayed on the bus.

When shown a photograph of OSWALD among other photographs, he immediately recognized the photograph and exclaimed that this was a photograph of OSWALD.

When asked how he knew this to be so, he stated that he has been a commercial artist all his life; that he is a member of the Academy of Fine Arts in Chicago, Illinois, and that he can recognize a face.

He did not state definitely that the young American on the bus was identical with OSWALD because he was not positive, but he remarked repeatedly that he was "the same general type."

When shown a standup photograph of OSWALD, he immediately exclaimed that the young American was "about the same size, the same type, and it seems to be," but he did not state positively that the young American was OSWALD.

He advised he wished he had been more observant about the young American on the bus.

He could not identify photographs of JOHN BOWEN, also known as ALBERT OSBORNE.

He stated that when he returned to Mexico following his departure by bus on October 2-3, 1963, he traveled by train to San Luis Potosi on or about November 30, 1963, and from San Luis Potosi traveled to San Miguel de Allende by bus.

He could not identify the photographs of JUAN MATEO DE CUBA and ADA FRANCISCA BISLIP DE CUBA.

He stated that the Mexican-American he talked to aboard the bus has a thinner face than that of JUAN MATEO DE CUBA and he repeated that the Mexican-American was a very nervous person.

He recalled that when the young American was taken off the bus, most passengers on the bus were sleeping.

He recalled that at the beginning of the trip at San Luis Potosi, there was some sort of discussion between a Mexican woman and the driver of the bus with regard to a seat number. He could not describe the Mexican woman nor the bus driver.

He was certain that no one he knows from San Miguel de Allende was aboard this bus.

He advised that he can be reached by telephone during the day only through RODOLFO PEREZ R., owner of the Auto Mercado Super Market, telephone number 33, located next door to 19 Calle Masones, San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, and he utilizes Post Office Box #200, San Miguel de Allende for receipt of mail.

He did not know the name of "the Mexican Immigration Inspector" who boarded the bus and took the young American temporarily off the bus, nor the identity of the United States Customs Officer who spoke to the young American at Nuevo Laredo.

VOORHEES advised that he would continue to search his mind for any other possible details with regard to the above and if he was able to recall anything, he would contact the confidential source abroad.

The names of the following passengers on the passenger list of bus #340, October 2, 1963, of the Transportes Frontera, S.A. de C.V. bus line, as follows, were exhibited to VOORHEES and he was unable to recognize any of these names as persons he might know:

The FM-5 #4325846 Mexican Tourist Card issued VOORHEES has typed toward the top the word "tren," meaning train, and this must have been typed on this form when VOORHEES entered Mexico by train, as he states he did.

It is apparent from VOORHEES' information above that he departed from Mexico via a Transportes del Norte bus and that the form FM-11 which shows VOORHEES' departure from Mexico by train is in error and that Mexican Immigration Service employee ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA, who handled VOORHEES' departure, was apparently at Kilometer 26 Check Station during his tour of duty from 12:00 midnight to 8:00 AM on October 3, 1963, and not at a railroad station.

An examination of Mexican Guia de Transportes Aereos y Autotransportes de Mexico (Guide for Air Travel and Automobile Transportation in Mexico), March 1964 issue, which is an official publication in Spanish of airline and automobile bus schedule in Mexico, reflects on page 19 that Transportes del Norte, which connects with Greyhound Lines, Union Bus Lines, Missouri Pacific Lines and Winter Garden Bus Lines, between Canada and the United States and Mexico, has bus stations located at Insurgentes #137 Sur, Mexico, D. F., and Juan Mendez 1355, Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico. This guide further reflects that in bus line schedule #18 for "Mexico - Guadalajara - San Luis Potosi - Monterrey - Torreon, via Central," on the daily departure of Transportes del Norte buses leaving Mexico, D. F., VOORHEES must have traveled aboard the bus which has the following listed schedule for departure on page 19 of the above guide:

The confidential source abroad advised that on March 30, 1964, VOORHEES furnished the following additional data by telephone from San Miguel de Allende:

He could not recognize the following names of non-Mexican tourists who departed from Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on October 3, 1963, as being identical with the Mexican-American and his wife who were aboard the bus with him:

He stated that he would be unable to recall the Mexican-American's name and wondered now if he actually heard the name.

He could not recall if the Mexican-American is or is not a Mexican citizen, but stated that he could definitely recognize him again.

He described him as being in his late 50's, tall and slim, who was very well dressed, and his wife was very well dressed. One definite characteristic of the Mexican-American is that he was very nervous and smoked one cigarette after another.

He could not recall any further details and was apologetic for not being able to do so. He stated that if the incident regarding the young American had happened during the day, he would have been more observant.

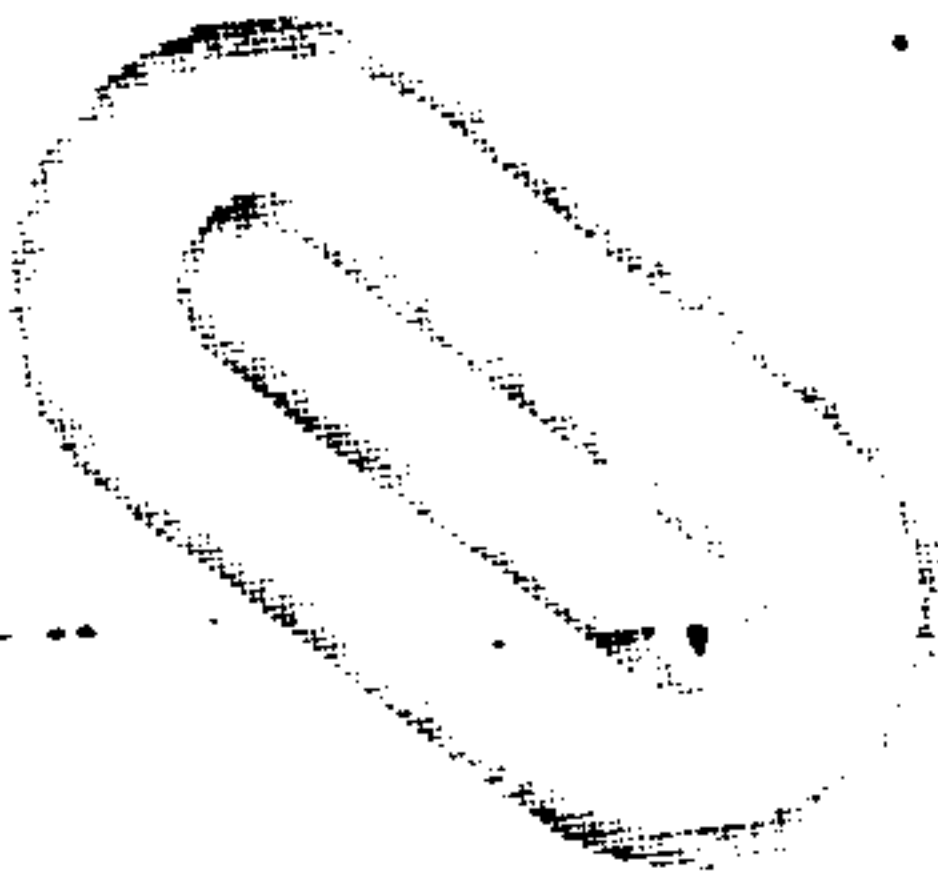

Suspense in Dallas

Will Ruby Follow Oswald in His Tragic Destiny?

A "Fort Worth Press" reporter accosted Oswald's mother and asked her if she previously had any apprehensions that an attempt might be made on the life of her son. Mrs. Marguerite Oswald replied that she did. She went on to state that 12 hours before her son was killed a policeman showed her a photograph of Jack Ruby and asked her to identify him. In this fashion, it has been successfully established that the Dallas police knew that Rubistein (sic) intended to dispose of the killer of the President.

In a statement to the press, the Chief of the Dallas Police, Jesse Curry, had to admit that on November 24, at 7 o'clock in the morning, he received a telephone call. It was a warning that Oswald would be killed. Glen King, Assistant to Chief Curry, confirmed that at 2:15 in the morning he had likewise spoken with an unknown party who told him that the alleged assassin of the President was going to be killed.

According to the "Dallas Morning News," the local police were certain that Oswald would not "arrive at the county jail alive."

Oswald's assassin, Jack Ruby, owed more than \$20,000 to the United States Treasury, and at the time he committed his crime "he was in a rather difficult financial situation," as the investigators put it. However, upon his arrest Ruby had \$2,000 on his person and another \$10,000 at home which was found in a shoe box.

The "Star Telegram" of Fort Worth stated that the head jailer at the Dallas jail is worried that Jack Rubistein may be poisoned before his trial as the assassin of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Jack has been saying over and over again that he has "confidence that his friends will not abandon him at a time like this." This clearly points to the fact that he did not act on his own as was at first claimed.

In view of the manifest inefficiency of the Dallas police, there are many people who think that Ruby may follow Oswald's fate by coming to a violent end at the hands of other people who are interested in sealing his lips.

(Translation of Captions:)

Jack Ruby may be poisoned to stop him from talking too much - The Chief of the Dallas Police, Jesse Curry, had to admit that he knew, as of 7 o'clock in the morning, that the presumed assassin of the President might be killed. However, he did nothing to prevent it.

Several hours before this happened, the Dallas police were warned against a possible attempt on the life of Lee Oswald. (This caption refers to both photos on page 11)

Oswald's Steps in Mexico

The buses entering the city from other parts of the Republic fan out into the streets in search of their terminals. Buenavista is a street where a large number of terminals for out-of-town buses are located. On one of its terminal buildings, on the eastern side of the street, a large sign blinks its neon red and blue lights at night and reads: "Border Transports. Mexico, Tampico, Monterrey, Matamoros and Laredo. Short Route. Ask for Information."

The waiting room is wide and dark. At one end there is a counter where people leave and pick up their baggage, where tickets are checked and where a list of the passengers arriving in the city on each trip is prepared. One of these passengers was Lee Oswald.

The employee who works the night shift starts his work at 4:00 p.m. His name is Lucio Lopez. He gave an evasive answer: "I do not know anything; I can hardly remember. Who could have anticipated? Here, ask the boss. He is the one who prepared the list. He saw him better than I did." However, he admitted: "It was the last week of September."

Efforts were being made to take a close look at the Mexicans who saw President Kennedy's assassin who, himself, was in turn assassinated.

Mr. Gilberto Lozano Guizar had a better recollection of the American who arrived in Mexico on September 26 of last year, in the afternoon, and who, throughout the trip from Laredo to the capital, occupied seat #4 next to the window.

"We know that he was the man because not many 'gringos' are in the habit of travelling on this line. Whenever there is one of them, we ask him to write his name on the passengers' list in order to avoid misspellings on our part. Oswald wrote his name. His full name. Later, we found out that he had not written his ticket number. Perhaps he did not understand us when we asked him to. In reality, he was a 'gringo' like many others. He was poorly dressed. He was wearing a sport shirt; no dress shirt, no coat; a single bag and nothing else. The way he looked suggested a rather withdrawn man. This is all I recall. He did not speak. He said nothing."

In our efforts to follow the steps Oswald took in Mexico, we left the terminal and went to Calles de Cerrada de Bernardino de Sahagun. It is a long and narrow street. A four-story building covered with red ceramic tile is the Hotel of Commerce. That is where Oswald stayed.

Sebastian Perez Hernandez, the reception clerk, receives the guests and assigns their rooms.

"I remember he was given room No. 18. It has a bathroom. I never spoke to him. I saw him come down the steps whenever he went out. I remember because no 'gringos' ever come to this hotel. It was a novelty to see him go out and return. He spent a few days, perhaps six or seven. A man who spoke to him on one occasion is my boss, Mr. Garcia. It seems that also the nightman spoke to him. He appeared to be a normal person; poor perhaps, but normal."

At the small restaurant where Oswald had some of his meals, the lady in charge, Mrs. Dolores Ramirez viuda de Barreiro, told us:

"Yes, of course. He had four meals here. He did not speak Spanish well and the first time we were not able to understand what he wanted. We served him what was there. As soon as the rice arrived, he asked for his check. After that, we knew. He only ate soup, rice and bread. He drank water. He ate like a hungry man. When we offered him the next course and brought it to him he said no with his head. Perhaps he did not have enough money."

It looks as though Oswald was, indeed, short of money while in Mexico: in eight days he spent a total of 329 pesos.

Translation of Captions:

- This is the bus terminal where Oswald arrived in Mexico last September.

- The alleged killer of the President stayed a few days at a modest hotel near Alvarado Bridge in his quest for a Cuban visa.

- At "The Hope Restaurant" he ate modestly. Oswald sat at the first table and ate inexpensive food. Dolores Ramirez viuda de Barreiro waited on him.

- Lucio Lopez sold him the return ticket to Nuevo Laredo eight days after his arrival here.

- Gilberto Lozano Guizar remembers that Oswald bought ticket No. 4 at the counter.

- Sebastian Perez never thought that Oswald might be a dangerous man. If anything, he thought that he was rather poor.
