Four Indicted in Test Of Cuba Travel Ban

The federal grand jury in Brooklyn which for a month has been investigating the recent trip to Cuba by 24 American students handed down four indictments on Sept. 27. The charges are conspiring to recruit and arrange for the trip.

The announcement of the indictments was made in Washington by Attorney General Robert Kennedy and in the federal prosecution office in Brooklyn.

Three of those indicted — Levi Laib, 24; Phillip Abbot, 26; and Stefan Martin, 24, had gone on the trip to Cuba. The fourth defendant, Anatole Schauer, 26, did not go.

Two others, Salvatore Corchiani, 19, and Ellen Irene Scahill, 29, were named as co-conspirators but were not indicted.

The indictment alleged 21 meet with persons, such as organizing a committee to promote the trip, meeting in New York and Buffalo, distribution of application forms, etc.

There is to be no testimony that the defendants had any knowledge of the government's position on the matter.

THE SUPREME COURT'S reversal of the conviction of 275 Negro students arrested at a demonstration in Orangeburg, S. C., three years ago, strikes a blow against the law of "breach of the peace" statutes against civil rights demonstrations.

The protest in the struggle for freedom, however, is that without a federal law curbing the Justice Department to use on behalf of a Negro denied his civil rights, the best police and politicians will do their best to suppress any attempt to bring about a change in the present state of affairs.

A second appeal reached the Supreme Court in 1962. Outside of the police and demonstrators leaders are being arrested and groups are being broken up. The Supreme Court has not yet ruled on the appeal.
