Señor Director:

Tengo el gusto de hacerle la presente para informarle que el asesinato del Presidente John F. Kennedy fue pagado por el Sr. Pedro Charles, agente de Fidel Castro en México, el cual hubo de entablar amistad con el ex-infante de Marina y tiradorocartero Lee H. Oswald en México y se les veía juntos frecuentar varios clubs nocturnos. El mencionado Pedro Charles hubo de entregarle a Oswald la cantidad de siete mil dolares por adelantado para los preparativos y después se le entregaría diez mil dolares al completarse el trabajo, es decir que el crimen fue tasado en diez y siete mil dolares.

El Sr. Pedro Charles que utiliza otros nombres falsos así como Pasaporte Diplomático para entrar o salir de México y Estados Unidos actualmente se encuentra en la residencia del Embajador Cubano en México, según las últimas informaciones que obran en mi poder. Ojala usted primero que nadie, la verdad del asesinato del Presidente Kennedy ocurrido en Dallas.

AGREEMENT **500188**

1. This agreement entered into this date between COMMERCIAL EMPLOYMENT AGENCY hereinafter referred to as the agency and _____ hereinafter referred to as applicant, in which the applicant agrees to pay and the agency agrees to receive in full payment for each employment secured a fee based on the following schedule, for permanent employment:
Up to \$149.99—30%; \$150.00 thru \$249.99—35%; \$250.00 thru \$349.99—40%; \$350.00 up to \$449.99—45%; \$450.00 and over's wages earned to each from any salary, drawing account, or association.
For temporary employment 10% of applicant's wages received in each from any salary, drawing account, or association.
2. It is agreed by the parties hereto that permanent employment is procured by applicant having three or more opportunities and satisfactory references; and that temporary employment is procured by applicant furnished in less than three calendar months by the employer.
3. It is further agreed that applicant shall at all times have the right to refuse any employment proffered without being required to give reasons for such refusal; and the service charge of the agency is earned when applicant accepts employment and is payable on salary is received.
4. If the charge made herein is for permanent employment which in fact becomes temporary, then applicant shall be entitled to a refund of the unexpended difference of the service charge. If a temporary placement becomes permanent a full permanent fee shall be due.
5. Should applicant accept a sales position involving a traveling period then the agency shall have the right of its option to determine a specific wage to pay the agency 75% of the first three months wages received on a basis for the fee due the agency. Upon this is done, applicant agrees to pay the agency 10% of all earnings received for the first three months of the trial period the fee due the agency will be awarded and any balance due paid.
6. Should applicant voluntarily leave a position that applicant has accepted, applicant agrees to pay the whole fee agreed upon, except that in no case will the fee amount to more than 45% of the total wages that applicant has received.
7. Should applicant accept a position through the agency and subsequently applicant's present employer offers better employment on a third level of applicant's having accepted a better outside job through the agency, applicant agrees that such other employment is a bona fide offer in order to the agency submitting referral and that acceptance of such offer from the present employer shall be considered as a placement for which applicant agrees to pay a fee in accordance with the schedule shown herein for permanent work.
8. The agency agrees that it will not under any interpretation of this contract make more than one service charge for any one referral.
9. It is agreed that acceptance of an introduction card by the applicant from the agency takes precedence over any previous application the applicant may have filed with an employer to which the introduction card is addressed.
10. Applicant hereby signifies and agrees to a penalty of fifteen (15%) per cent an attorney's fee, on the service charge and percentage fee due the agency should it become necessary for the agency to obtain counsel or collection service, or resort to court action to collect same.
11. Applicant hereby grants investigation of business and personal references on given an application card, and any information provided by such investigation shall be held confidential between the agency and the prospective employer.
12. It is agreed and understood that transportation to and from interviews will be borne by the job applicant.
13. Should applicant fail to pay the service charge on insertion agreed, applicant may by mutual agreement with the employer authorize the employer with whom placed by the agency to deduct from any salary, drawing account or association the amount due the agency and to pay same to the agency.
14. I have read the above agreement, and I fully understand and will abide by its contents.

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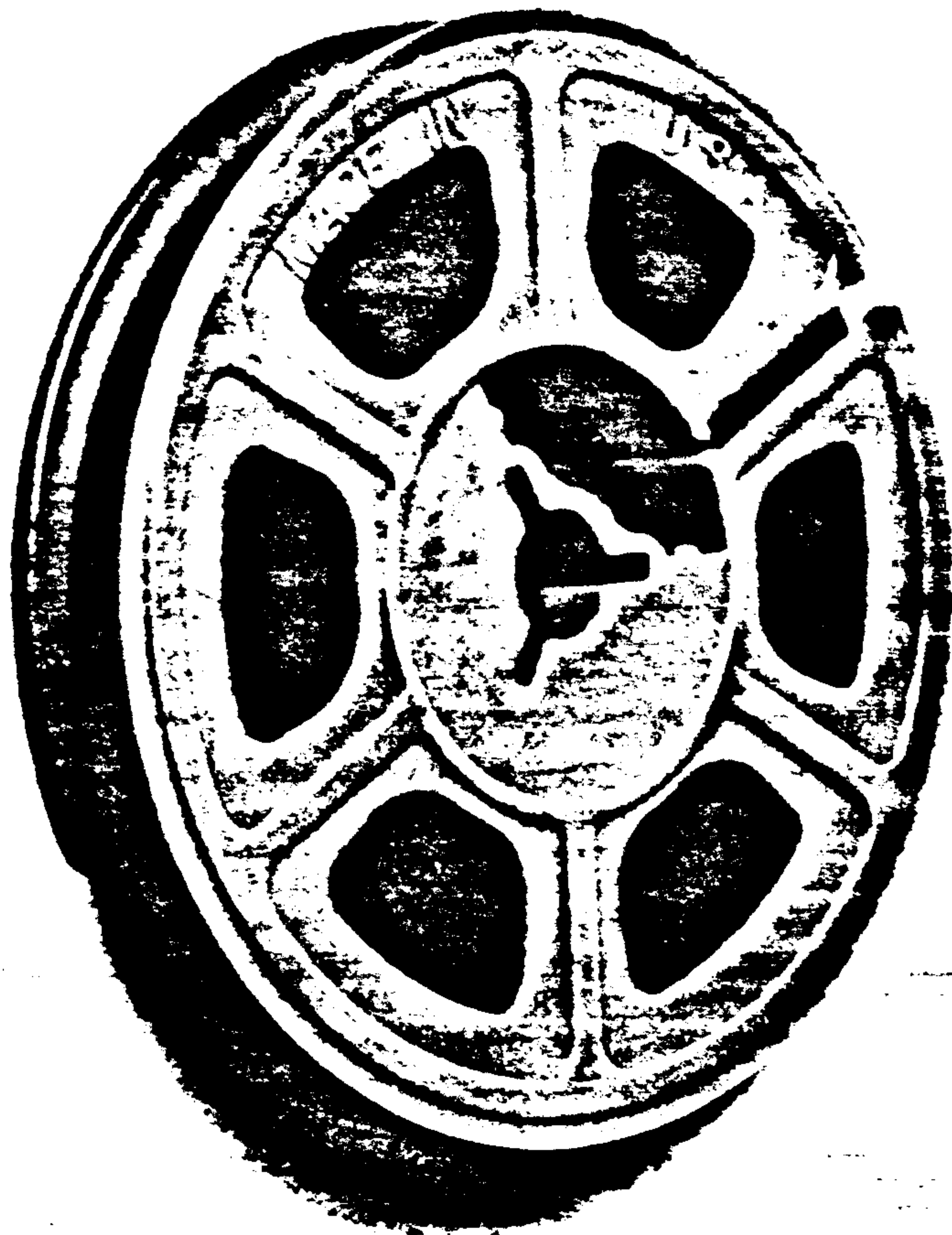
