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**INFORMATION FOR INTERSTATE CLAIMANTS**

This booklet contains information important to you as an interstate claimant. It contains a record of your reporting and is your identification card in relation to your claim. Always bring it with you when reporting.

Workers who leave the State in which they previously worked are permitted to file claims for unemployment insurance in any other State, the District of Columbia, or in Canada.

Louisiana, where you are filing your claim, is acting as the Agent State for the State against which you are filing your claim. The State against which you are filing is called the "Labor" State.

Information you submit through your Louisiana area office will be transmitted to the State against which you are filing; and from this information and that contained in their records, the State against which you are filing will determine your eligibility for benefits.

**IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS CONCERNING INSTRUCTIONS IN THIS BOOK, LET CONTACT YOUR AREA OFFICE. THE REPRESENTATIVE WILL BE GLAD TO ANSWER YOUR QUESTIONS.**

**WEEK OF WAITING**

Most States require that you serve a waiting period of one week after your new claim is filed before benefits become payable. This means that if the State against which you file requires a week of waiting you will not be compensated for the first week for which you claim benefits.

**MONETARY ELIGIBILITY**

The State State will determine the benefits, if any, you are eligible to receive, based on wages you have earned in the base period of your claim. You will be notified in writing by the Louisiana area office of your monetary eligibility. This notification will show the relative dates of the above mentioned base period. Bring your copy of the monetary determination with you on your next scheduled visit to your area office after you receive it and show it to the Claims Taker. This will insure that area office records are properly indexed. Proper indexing of your claim records will prove of assistance to you in obtaining weekly benefits. If you have any questions concerning the determination received, inquire of the person at the counter who issues your claim.

**AVAILABILITY FOR WORK**

All States require that a claimant, in order to be eligible for benefits, must be able to work and available for work. Able to work means that you are physically able to perform work of a nature similar to work you have performed in the past or other work for which you are reasonably paid by an-

**REGISTRATION FOR WORK**

You must register for work with the area office where you file your claim. Louisiana must certify to the Labor State that you are registered for work.

persons, including, or otherwise. Any such information will normally also show the reasons that you are ready to accept work at once without unreasonable remarks; that there are no circumstances, personal or otherwise, which would prevent you from immediately accepting suitable work. These Labor Rules require that a claimant make a reasonable effort to find work for himself in addition to his registration for work with our employment service. You must report your personal efforts to find work for yourself in the space provided in each Unemployed Claim Form. Be sure to provide all data required for this entry in the Unemployed Claim Form to insure that your claim is not disallowed. All States require that you be willing to accept suitable work in the locality where you are filing your claim at the prevailing rate of pay and under working conditions which prevail there. If you have been unable to work or not available for work and you become available for work, you may re-submitting your claim for payment due by reporting these facts to the Claims Office who will carry the information to the Labor state.

#### DISQUALIFICATIONS

If you quit your job or if you are DISCHARGED BECAUSE OF MISCONDUCT or if you are not willing because of a LABOR DISPUTE, you may be disqualified for benefits. Disqualifications differ, depending upon the law of the State you are filing against and the circumstances involved. If you are awarded a disqualification, you will be notified in writing by the Labor State, showing why you were disqualified. The disqualification

information will normally also show the reasons of the disqualification and how it can be avoided. If you RECEIVE WORK you are OFFERED in the area where you are filing a written report will be furnished the Labor State which will determine whether or not you are to be disqualified for seeking suitable work.

#### REPORTING EARNINGS

Should you perform work during any week in which you claim benefits, you must report to us the amount of earnings for that week. Earnings from any source may result in your being disqualified. You should report your earnings as they are earned and not necessarily as they are paid. Pages 15 and 16 of this booklet provide a schedule to assist you in reporting a record of your earnings.

#### DISQUALIFICATION FOR FRAUD

All State laws provide legal penalties for persons who obtain benefits fraudulently. Persons who obtain benefits as a result of a false statement or representation, knowing it to be false, or knowingly fail to disclose a material fact, may receive an administrative penalty by the Labor State or pay be prosecuted under the laws of Louisiana.

#### APPEAL INFORMATION

Every determination issued by a Labor State contains information concerning the claimant's appeal rights. You should note the date on which your appeal rights expire and you dispute with a determination, you

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should file your appeal before that date. If you do not, you may lose your appeal rights. It is best that you file your appeal at the area office so that you may obtain the latest area office of the Orléans Parish and so that your appeal will be filed on expedited forms. In the event of a prompt hearing, if you cannot appear in the area office to file your appeal, you may preserve your appeal rights by writing a letter to the area office explaining why you cannot attend the determination in person.

#### TRACING YOUR CLAIM

There will be a normal delay in the processing of your claim because all matters pending should be handled by each Bureau. However, should there be any unusual or exceptional delay, you should contact the area office in which your claim was filed. There is a procedure whereby the area office can trace your claim for you. If this is impracticable, you may trace your claim by writing directly to the Labor State Control Office in New Orleans. If you do this, always include your social security number in your letter, preferably sent to your home.

#### PULLING FOR BENEFITS AWAY FROM YOUR REGULAR AREA OFFICE

If you are to be away from the area office of your area office on your scheduled reporting day, you should contact your area office before you leave. You will be given instructions as to how to file for benefits in another area office. If you cannot contact

your area office before leaving, you should explain why you could not do so in the Direct Official Claim you file in the other area office. Such an explanation of why you are filing away from your area office. These Direct Official Claims should be sent to your area office where your claim was established. (We suggest that you show this instruction to the Orléans Parish accepting your claim.)

#### RENEWING OR REOPENING YOUR CLAIM

Following are conditions which require that you file a renewal claim (Additional Louisiana Claim, Form IS-1) or, in other words, normally reopen your claim:

1. You move from one State to another and wish to renew there subsequently or at least in course of two report periods.
2. You fail to report on two consecutive scheduled reporting days.

#### CLAIMING BENEFITS AFTER BECOMING EMPLOYED

If you claim steady work between scheduled reporting days, call or write your area office and report the facts. You may be entitled to a payment based on earnings during the dependent period involved.

#### COOPERATION

You are encouraged to cooperate with area office personnel in matters concerning your claim. They are trained personnel, and their help and advice are available to assist you.

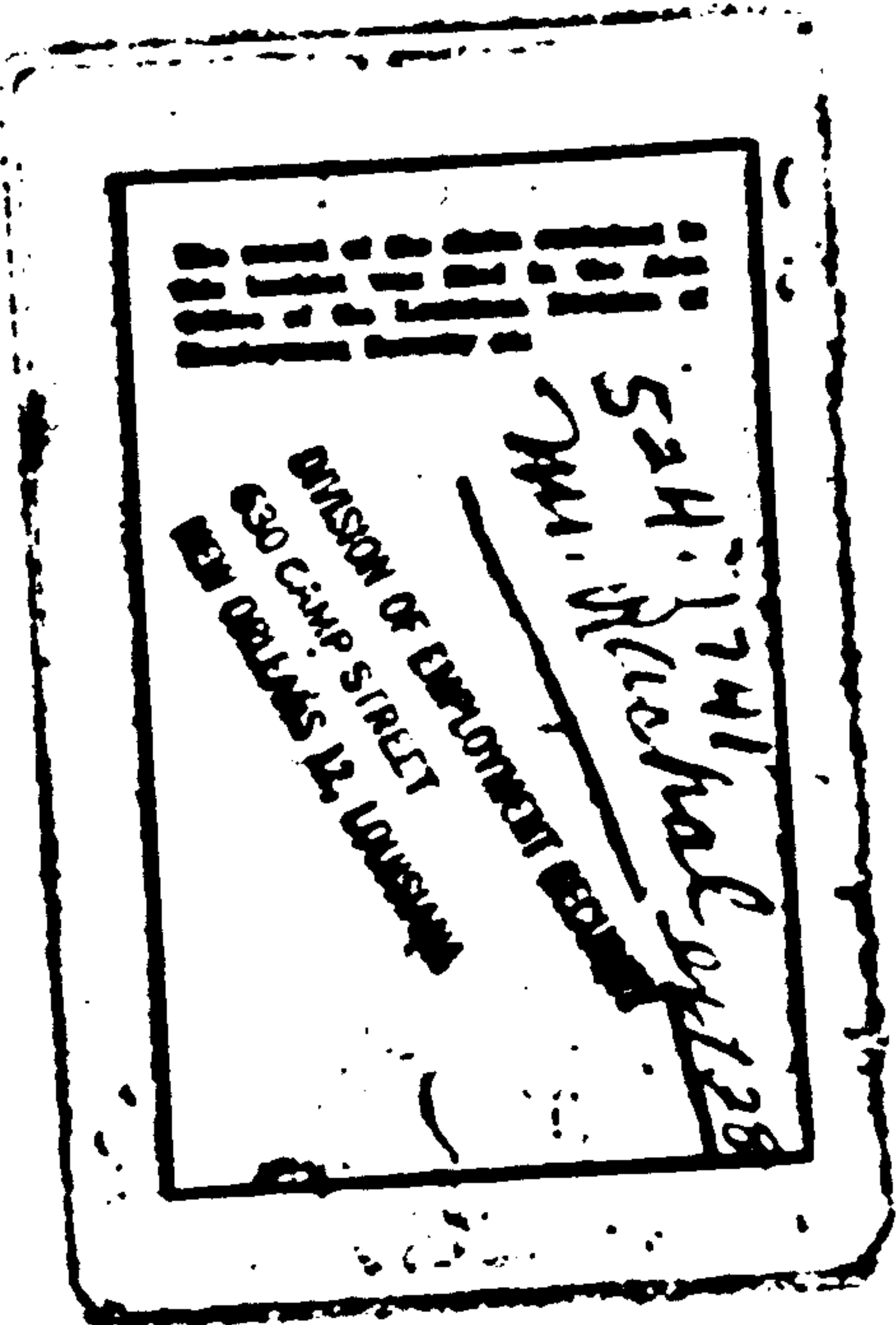

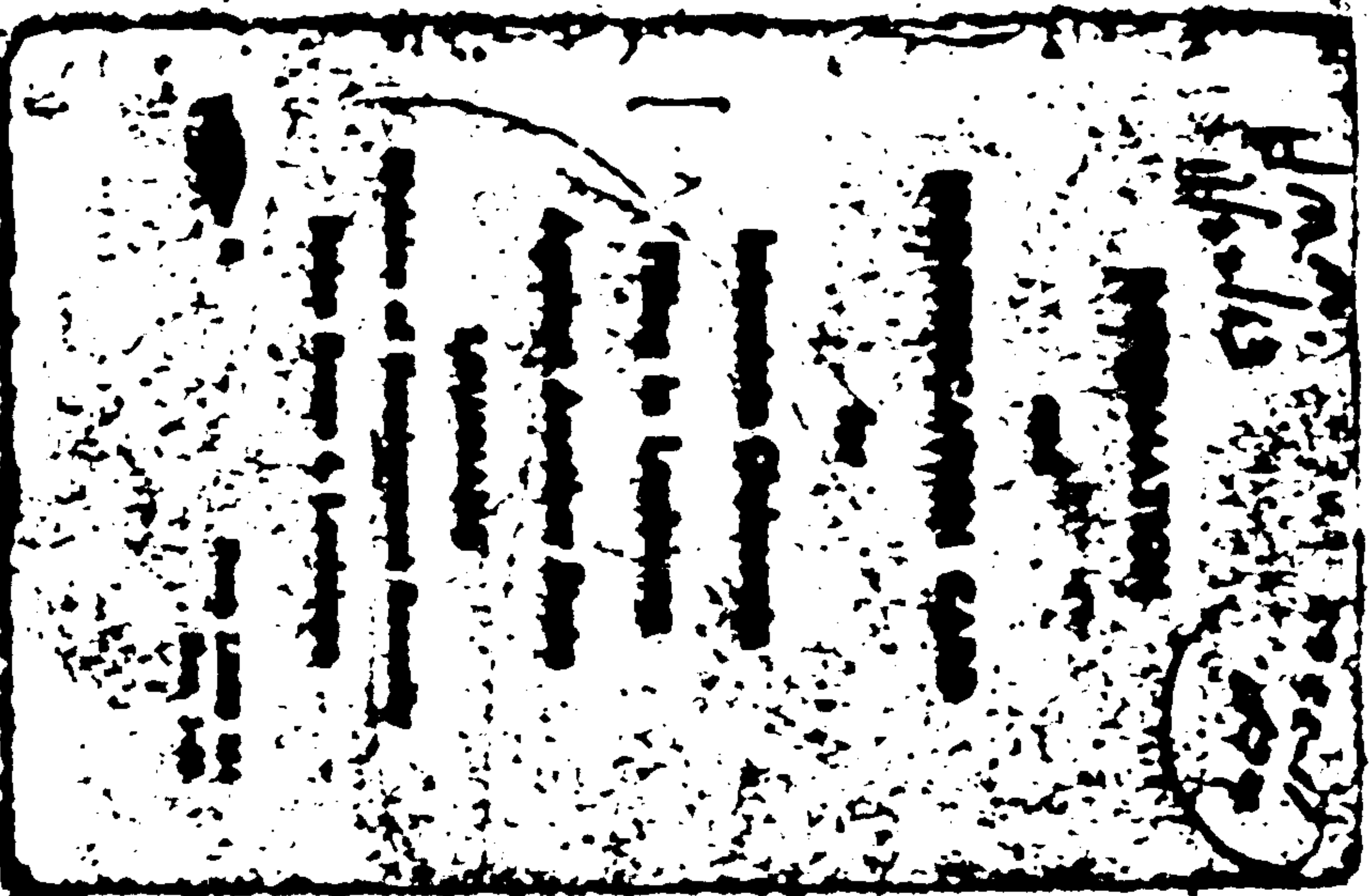

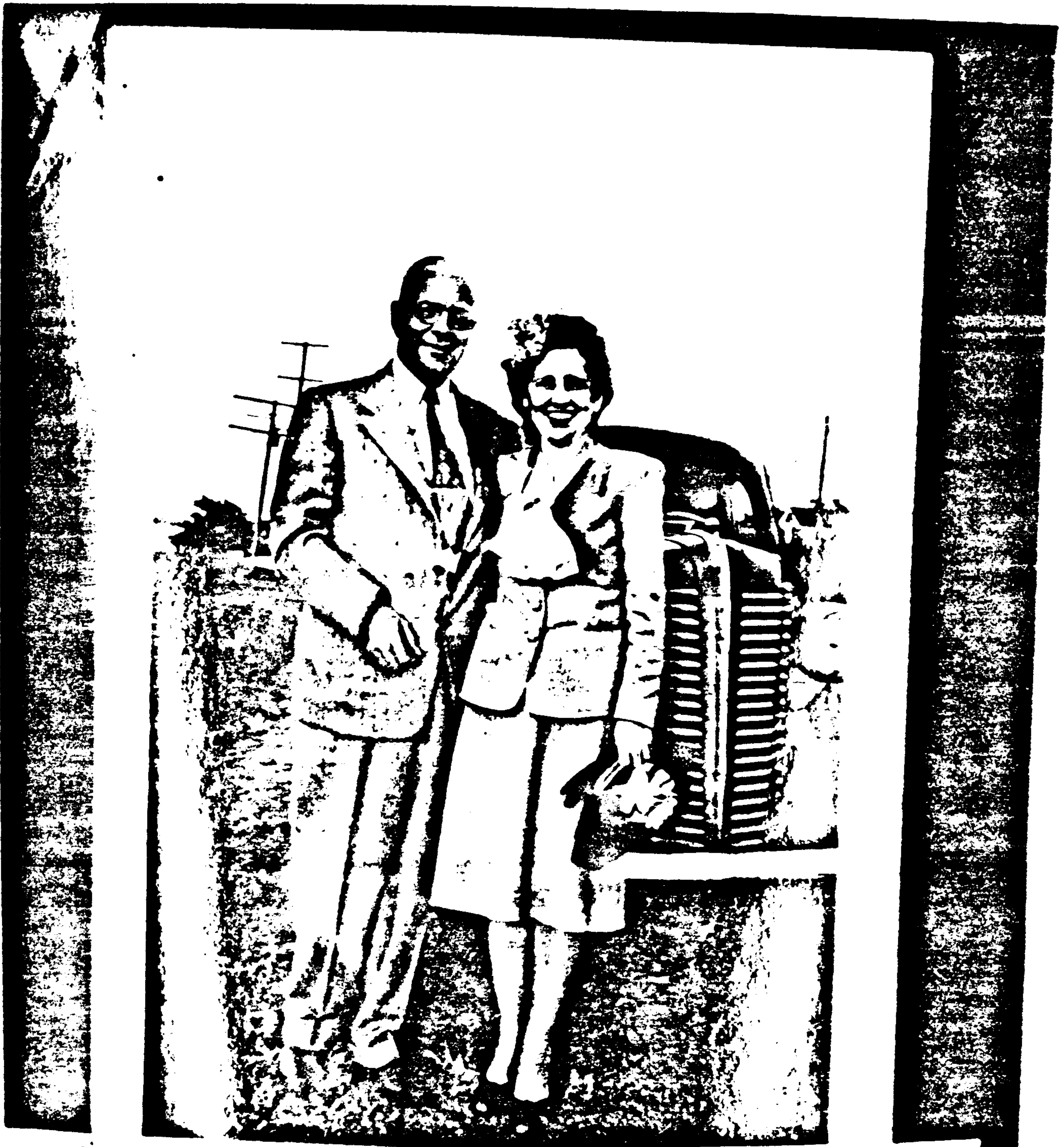

# A Vicious Stranger Hurls Acid And Blinds a Blind Man's Dog

Police are hunting for one of the cruelest of all people — someone who blinded the guide dog of a blind man by throwing acid into the animal's eyes.

And because the dog's owner, Luigi Molteni, 33, a telephone operator, cannot see, the police have no clue as to who might have done it.

It wasn't until a month after the dog, Prima, had been blinded that anyone noticed anything was wrong with her.

Molteni entered Prima, a 7-year-old German shepherd, in an international dog show at Turin, Italy, last October 27.

Instead of behaving in her usual well-trained manner, Prima didn't obey commands, nearly bumped into obstacles and barely saved her master from being run down by cars driven along a mock road.

A spectator joked loudly: "That guide dog looks as if it needs a guide dog for itself!"

Officials of the show didn't think it was a laughing matter, however.

A veterinarian took one look at Prima, passed his hand in front of her eyes and said "This dog is blind."

Molteni, who has been blind for six years, wept behind his dark glasses.

"She's been like this for a month," he said. "She's frightened and uncertain every time we come to the edge of a sidewalk, a busy street or some unexpected obstacle."

"But she's still managed to take me to the center of Milan from my home 21 miles away — and then back again."

"We walk together through crowded streets, travel together on buses and trains in the rush hour."

"How can she be blind?"

The surgeon told Molteni that Prima had been guiding him all that time from memory.

"She's been making her way from your home to work and back again for so long that she is able to make the trip from

memory," he said. "She's also aided by familiar sounds and smells and by recollection of danger spots she knew when she could see."

At first, it was thought that

Prima had cataracts on both eyes.

Then an eye specialist examined her and found she had been blinded by sulfuric acid.

Last January 15, the specialist operated on Prima free of charge.

With the dog under anesthetic for 5 1/2 hours, he removed the upper layer of the left eyeball, uncovering healthy tissue underneath.

When the operation was over and the effects of the anesthetic had worn off, Prima scrambled to her feet and staggered around the operating room peering at

things through her left eye.

Within two days, wearing a special muzzle to prevent her from scratching the eye, she was back on the job of guiding her master to and from work.

An operation on Prima's right eye is planned for later this summer.

Said Molteni: "I'd like to meet the person who threw the acid at Prima."

"He must hate either dogs or blind people."

"I would offer him my hand in friendship, because a person with that kind of twisted soul needs a friend."

# Gripes to City About His Taxes — Should Be Higher, He Says

LeRoy Neal argued bitterly when the tax on his home was increased.

But Neal's complaint shocked the tax board — because he insisted his tax was too low.

"My increase was only \$21 while my neighbors had to pay from \$53 to \$95 more a year," said Neal, 55.

"It isn't fair, because we're taxed according to the value of our homes. Since my house is worth as much as theirs, I should be taxed just as much."

"It's a matter of pride."

Last March 20 Neal appeared before the tax board of review in Lansing, Mich., and waited his turn to speak while dozens of angry citizens complained that their tax increases were too high.

When Neal stood up to speak, officials expected him to argue about the \$21 increase over his previous year's tax of \$160.

But Neal gave them the surprise of their lives.

"I've got a nice, six-room house I've just improved with a recreation room with a sound proof ceiling," he said.

"As a result, my home is worth at least as much as my neighbors' homes — and I ought to get a much bigger tax increase."

Board officials were shocked. "We just didn't know what to do," said County Tax Assessor Gerald Ernst.

"It was the first time any of us had ever heard a citizen complain his taxes were too low."

Neal was asked to think the matter over and come back a few days later, but he insisted that his mind was already made up.

"I'm being taxed at the rate of owning a home worth \$8,000, and that's an insult," Neal complained.

"Because my home is now worth at least \$12,000."

When Neal kept complaining, board members finally examined the improvements that he made in his home.

Last March 30 they gave him what he wanted — they added another \$42 to his tax.

"Now I pay a tax of \$223 on my home — an increase of \$63 over last year," Neal said.

"But I'm a happy man. Because now all my neighbors know my home is worth just as much as theirs."

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# Washington Insiders Are Talking A

**WASHINGTON** — The hottest story making the rounds here is that the U.S. Justice Department prevented the arrest of Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby BEFORE the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Oswald and the man who killed him, Ruby, were suspected of being partners in crime seven months before the President's death.

The incredible details of the story are so explosive that officials won't even answer "no comment" when queried about it. But the story being discussed by top-level government officials reveals:

1. That the Justice Department deliberately kept Oswald and Ruby out of jail before the assassination.
2. That Dallas cops suspected Oswald of being the gunman and Ruby the paymaster in a plot to murder former

## EXCLUSIVE

There is a suspicion among the American public that there is more to the story behind the assassination of President Kennedy and his slayer, Lee Oswald, than has been disclosed.

The ENQUIRER prints this article in the hope it will lead to the solution of the mystery surrounding these tragic events.

A top-secret document — a letter signed by a high official of the Justice Dept. — was sent in April 1963 from the Justice Dept. to Dallas Chief of Police Jesse E. Curry requesting the Dallas police NOT to arrest Oswald and Ruby in connection with the attempted slaying of General Walker.

After a sniper shot at, but missed General Walker in Dallas, April 30, 1963, Dallas police suspected that Oswald was the sniper and Ruby the payoff man.

The cops were set to arrest the pair. But they never got the chance because of the heavy pressure brought to bear by the Justice Dept. And so Oswald and Ruby were allowed to remain free. And seven months later, on last November 22 in Dallas, Oswald was able to kill the President of the United States.

The top-secret document — a copy of it is reportedly in the hands of the Presidential commission investigating the assassination — bares a web of intrigue that involves the Federal Bureau of Investigation, along with the Justice Dept. and the Central Intelligence Agency.

It is so politically explosive that the Presidential commission headed by Supreme Court Chief Justice Earl Warren, has even withheld it from one of its own members, Senator Richard Russell (D., Ga.).

It is feared that Senator Russell, who leads the South in the fight against the civil rights bill, might use the document as a weapon against the Justice Dept. and its chief, Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy, a leader in the fight for civil rights.

Major General Edwin A. Walker — seven months before the President was assassinated.

3 That the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency was using Ruby to recruit commandos for raids against Castro's Cuba. To prevent this explosive information from being disclosed, the CIA asked the Justice Dept. to step in and stop the Dallas police from arresting Jack Ruby, as well as Oswald.

The document — requesting the cops not to arrest Ruby and Oswald — contradicts the FBI report on the assassination and the subsequent murder of Oswald.

According to the New York Times, the FBI report, which was turned over to the Justice Dept. on December 4 and then to the Presidential commission five days later, concludes "that there was no link between Oswald and Jack Ruby."

The Times added, in its issue of December 10:

"Speculation that Oswald and Ruby knew each other, or in some way were part of a prior vendetta or association, is completely discounted in the report."

The ENQUIRER learned, however, that on the day Ruby killed Oswald, a man named Bill DeMar told reporters he saw Oswald in Ruby's Carousel night club.

DeMar, under the stage name of Bill Crowe, was then master of ceremonies at the club.

# Dallas Cops Linked Murder Try in April • U.S. Justice Dept. Blocked Their Arrest Months Before JFK

The ENQUIRER traced DeMar to an Evansville, Ind., night club and questioned him on April 11. He told our reporter that he had seen Oswald sitting in the Carousel on the night of November 21 — the night before Oswald assassinated President Kennedy.

DeMar said "I gave the FBI a statement about seeing Oswald in the club and that was it. I told them the same thing I'm telling you."

"I signed it and have heard nothing more about the incident to this day."

And on March 17, just three days after a jury voted the death penalty for Ruby, the Associated Press reported from Dallas:

"District Attorney Henry Wade has disclosed how prosecutors made the 'big decision' of the Jack Ruby murder trial."

"The decision: They would not call witnesses who swore they saw Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald together before a sniper assassinated President Kennedy here."

"Testimony from these witnesses would have made world-wide headlines. And, if jurors had believed the testimony, it would have provided a motive for the slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald."

"Wade said FBI agents and other investigators provided him with a list of witnesses who insisted they had seen Ruby and Oswald together at various times."

"The district attorney said he decided not to call these witnesses because he had doubts

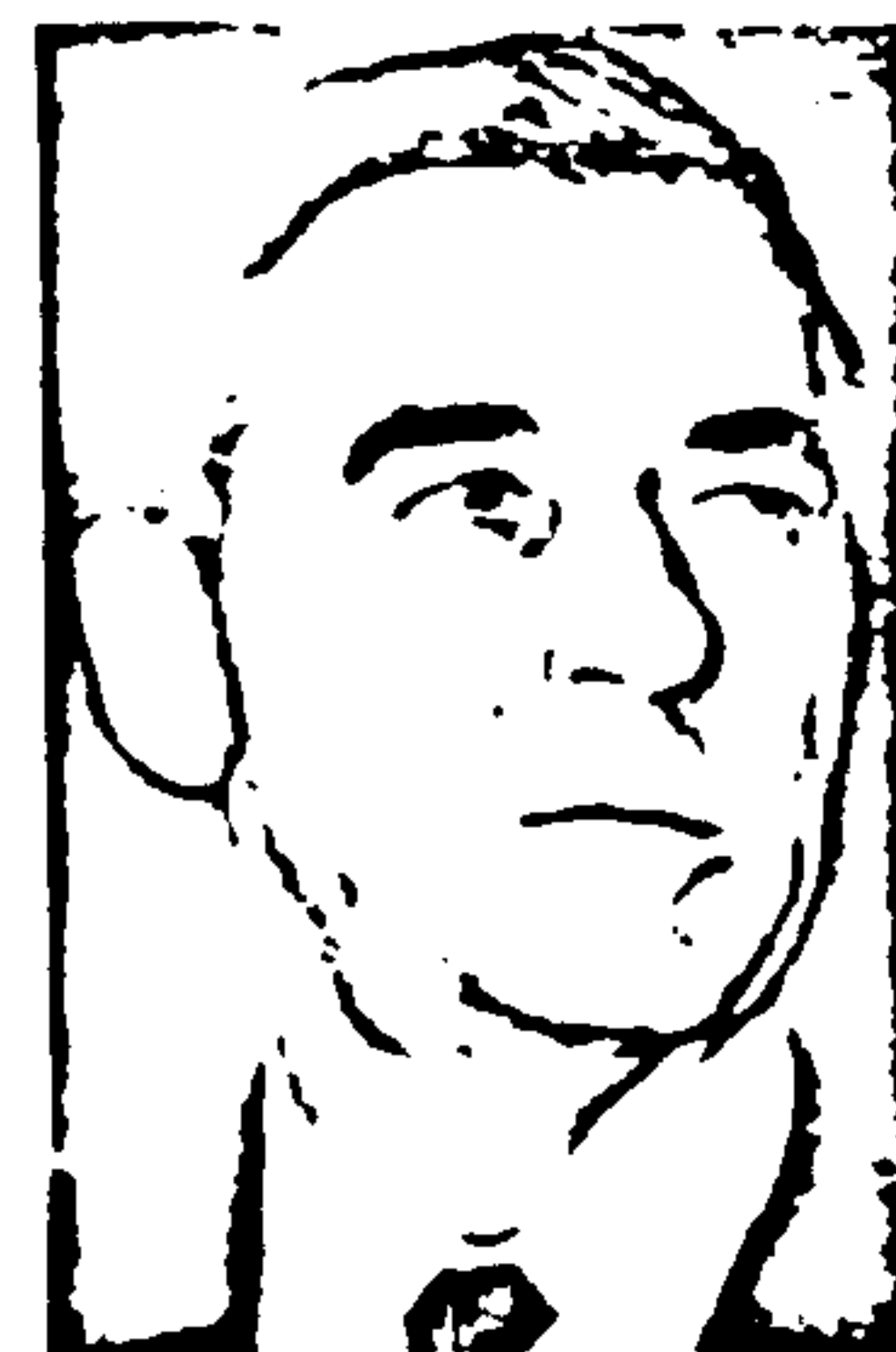
about the accuracy of their statements."

And the New York Times, in an article from Dallas dated March 15, reported:

"Some law enforcement officials in Dallas continued to believe that a connection (between Ruby and Oswald) was possible but, if so, that it was personal and did not necessarily involve the assassination."

The FBI became involved in the undercover maneuverings to stop the arrest of Oswald and Ruby shortly after the attempt to snuff out the life of Gen. Walker, who had been preaching ultraconservatism since he was relieved of his command in Germany.

Walker then resigned from the Army.

A high FBI official was asked by a top official in the Justice Dept. after it was notified by the CIA of the potentially volatile situation in Dallas to request Dallas police not to arrest Oswald or Ruby.

The FBI official refused to do it, saying it would be obstructing justice and therefore would be a crime.

The FBI man said he would make the request only if he were officially directed to do so in communication signed by a top official.

The FBI official then received a signed directive. He contacted Dallas police and urged them not to arrest Oswald and Ruby.

But the Dallas police all wanted an official signed communication.

Thereupon the Justice Dept. sent the communication to Dallas Police Chief Curry asking that Oswald and Ruby be kept strictly alone.

The department explained it didn't want Oswald and Ruby arrested because of "reasons of state."

The Justice Dept. was making the request on behalf of the CIA. Because the CIA was deeply involved with Ruby — and probably Oswald, too!

CIA agents had been using Ruby to recruit men in the Dallas area to serve as commandos against Castro's government in Cuba.

And they didn't dare let Ruby be arrested and chance such information getting out.

There were also indications that Oswald himself might have

been working both sides of the fence -- as a double agent for both the Communists and the CIA.

So both Oswald and Ruby were left at liberty.

For the next few months Oswald took part in demonstrations in support of Castro, then went to Mexico City and tried to get a visa to visit Russia by way of Cuba.

Oswald's application for a visa was turned down.

Last October 3 he arrived back in Dallas. A week earlier it had been announced that President Kennedy would visit Dallas on November 22.

On October 14 Oswald got a room in a rooming house near the Texas School Book Depository in Dallas. The next day he

got a job at the depository as an order filler.

And it was from a sixth-floor window of that depository that Oswald, last November 22, fired the shots that killed President Kennedy and wounded Texas Governor John Connally.

Oswald escaped and was captured an hour and a half later, but not before he had shot Dallas policeman J.D. Tippitt to death.

Two days later, as a stunned world watched on television, Jack Ruby dashed up and shot Oswald to death as police were leading the handcuffed Oswald through a basement corridor of City Hall.

Ruby, the Dallas night club owner, went on trial for that killing on March 4. He was convicted of "murder with malice" on March 14.

But after the assassination of President Kennedy and the killing of Oswald the investigations came.

And no satisfying answers were really found, except that evidence was overwhelming that the President had been killed by Oswald.

The same Oswald who had gone to Russia in 1959, pledged allegiance to the Soviet Union and tried to become a Russian citizen.

The Russians supposedly, for whatever reason, turned him down and he finally came back to America with his Russian-born wife, Marina, and their baby daughter in June 1962.

From then on he tried to get mixed up in left-wing activities, ordering all kinds of Communist literature and eventually becoming a loud supporter for Castro's Cuba.

He and his family lived first in Fort Worth, Tex., and then moved to Dallas.

In addition to the apartment he had with his wife and child he rented a room under the name of "A. H. Bell."

On March 20, 1963, he received a rifle under that name from a mail-order firm located in Chicago.

On April 10 a sniper fired a rifle bullet through a window of the Dallas home of Gen. Walker.

Gen. Walker was working at his desk on his income tax returns.

The bullet missed his head by scant inches, went through a 9-inch wall and came out in another room.

Dallas police investigation showed that the sniper shot from an alley 150 feet from the Walker home, using a fence to steady the rifle.

Dallas police also had the report of a witness who was near

the Walker home at the time of the slaying.

The witness told them shortly after the attempt on Walker's life that he saw two men, not one, run to an auto and make their getaway.

And within a few days after the shot was fired Dallas police felt they had a complete case.

Then came the fantastic series of maneuvers cloaked in secrecy which kept Oswald -- the man who was to assassinate President Kennedy -- a free man.

After the slaying, President Johnson appointed a seven-member commission, headed by Justice Warren, to inquire into the assassination.

Then, just after the commission began work, it was reported by United Press International on December 6 that Oswald's

wife, Marina, had informed the FBI that her husband told her excitedly in April 1963 that he

tried to kill Gen. Walker.

The FBI declined to comment

on this news but said its investigation was continuing.

The New York Times reported, in a story datelined from Dallas on December 7, that evidence developed this week showed that it (the rifle used to kill President Kennedy) was first used April 10 to fire into the home here of Edwin A. Walker.

On February 4, the day after Marina Oswald's first appearance before the Warren commission, Chief Justice Warren told reporters that Marina's testimony "may not be released in your lifetime."

The Chief Justice said that the testimony would be preserved for the public but that it may be suppressed for decades. He finished his statement to the press with: "I say this seriously."

J. Lee Rankin, general counsel to the Warren commission, also talked to reporters on that day. He said that Mrs. Oswald's testimony dealt with her husband's activities in the U.S. after he returned from Russia. Rankin also said that Mrs. Oswald offered the commission some "new evidence."

Later that same day Warren refused to confirm Rankin's reference to "new evidence."

Two fantastic turns in the Oswald-Ruby mystery were front-paged in the New York Journal-American of Sunday, February 23.

First, the paper revealed that one of the men who put the finger on accused assassin Oswald also had been shot.

The man, Warren Reynolds, said he saw Oswald running away, putting new shells into a pistol as he fled, after officer Tippitt was shot to death.

Then, in January, Reynolds was closing up his office when

he was shot in the temple with a bullet fired from a 22-caliber rifle.

The Journal-American said that "a local desperado named Garner was picked up by the police after the shooting but was cleared."

And this resulted in the second startling revelation: Garner's girl, Betty (Mooney) McDonald, took a lie detector test that helped to clear him. And this same Betty McDonald had worked as a stripper in Jack Ruby's Carousel.

In early February, Betty was arrested for engaging in a public brawl with a roommate -- and a week later she hanged herself in her cell.

Another person who has added to the deepening mystery of the Ruby-Oswald link is Mark Lane, a former New York Assemblyman, who claims to represent Oswald.

According to the New York Times of Thursday, March 5, Lane gave sensational evidence in Washington to the Warren commission.

The Times said that Lane, who has frequently challenged the view that Oswald was guilty of shooting Kennedy, had told the commission he'd heard of a secret meeting in a Dallas night club eight days before the President was killed.

Lane told the commission that at the secret meeting November 14 were J.D. Tippitt, the Dallas patrolman who was slain while trying to arrest Oswald; Bernard Weissman, a New York resident who had placed an anti-Kennedy advertisement in a Dallas newspaper the day the President was shot; and a third person.

The mystery deepened even further when Lane would not state publicly who this third person was.

But the commission knows the identity of the Mystery Man because Lane told it to them after the hearing room was cleared of newsmen and spectators.

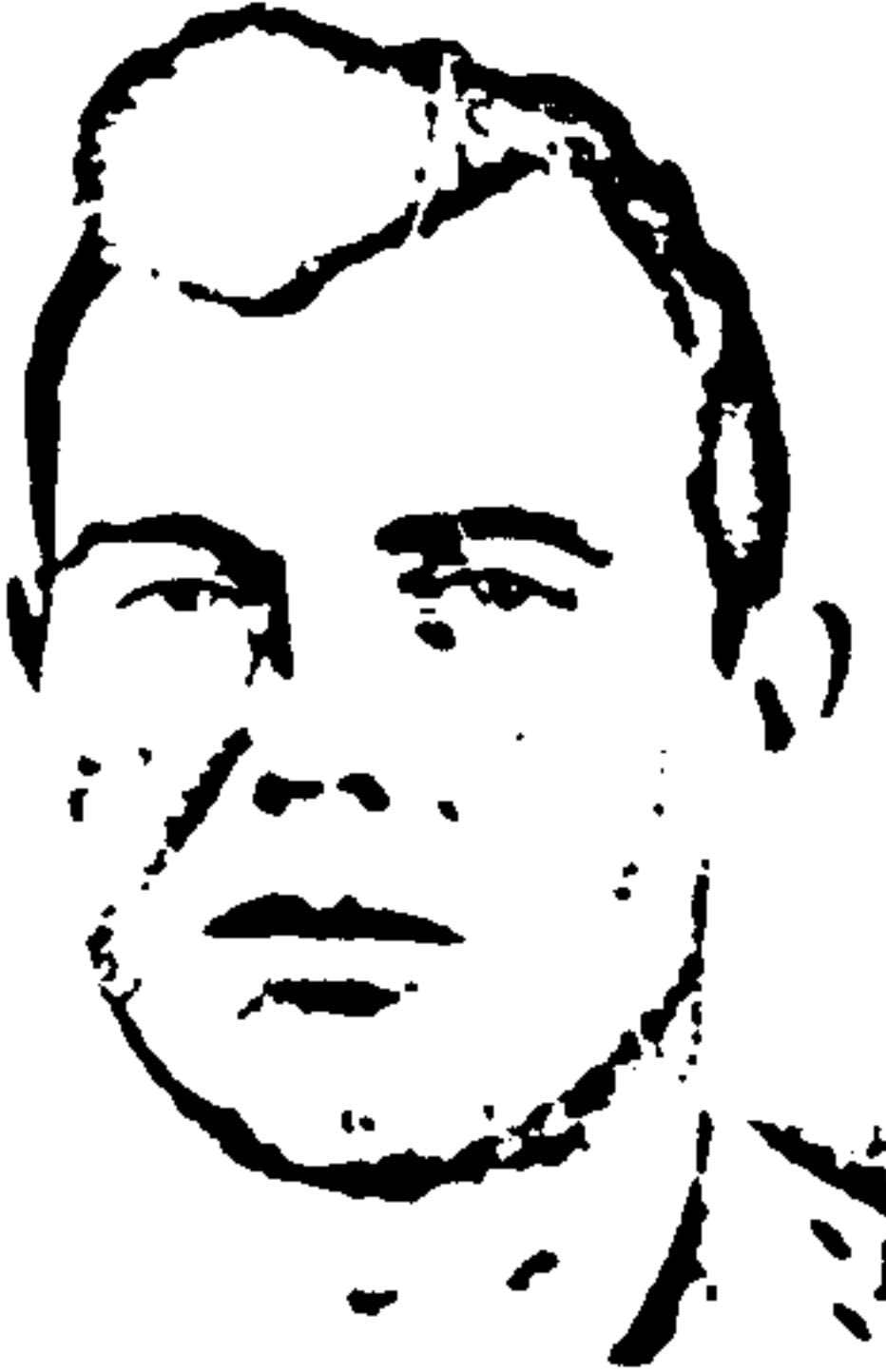
Lane had said that the secret November 14 meeting was held in Ruby's Carousel Club, and when the public hearing of the commission resumed, Justice Warren asked a question loaded with dynamite:

"Mr. Lane, what was the PURPOSE of this meeting in Dallas?"

But the purpose remains a secret, because Lane answered that his information did not indicate what they were talking about.

But, Lane said, Tippitt, Weissman and the Mystery Man

# He Takes Nap & Is Trapped 8 Days in a Shaft

Evaristo Maldonado was tired out. All he wanted was to find a place where he could take a long, uninterrupted snooze.

And he found just the spot — an unused brick shaft in a hospital basement. So the 60-year-old laborer crawled through the opening and settled down for the night.

Nobody interrupted him because nobody knew he was there. Not even the two men who came along early the next morning and bricked up the only opening to Evaristo's makeshift bedroom in the Juarez, Mexico, hospital.

It was too dark inside for them to see clearly and Evaristo had crawled well inside the narrow shaft to avoid being seen.

Evaristo slumbered on. There was plenty of air coming through a ventilation grille and Evaristo had no problem with breathing.

But when he woke up, he soon found he had a more urgent problem. He couldn't get out.

He screamed but nobody heard him even though the hospital's doctors and nurses were working only 10 feet above him.

By the fourth day, the starving Evaristo was eating the dirt he managed to scratch out from the walls. When that gave out, he ate his own clothes.

For water, he sucked the sweat

from his hands and face.

He lost track of time in the endless silence and the pitch black made him go blind from the effort of straining his eyes.

Evaristo might still have been in the shaft if, on the eighth day, Emilio Gomez and Julia Guadalupe hadn't gone into the cellar to check the heating and ventilation.

They found that one of the shafts had been blocked by mistake. It took only a few minutes to knock out the bricks.

Gomez shined a flashlight inside and its beam fell on the face of Evaristo.

"It's a ghost," he screamed. Their cries were heard by hospital workers who ran down to the basement and found Evaristo, now a 30-lb bag of skin and bones, crouching on all fours.

"I was tired," he moaned. "I

just wanted to rest."

Cautiously the living skeleton was carried upstairs and put to bed after being given stimulants and injections of liquid food.

Within a few days of his rescue — last November 1 — his sight returned and he was on the way to recovery.


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# Teenager Wants Cops to Kill Him, So He Murders

Sixteen-year-old Charles Morris stood at a window of his home with a rifle and looked out.

The first person he saw was Kenneth Beebe, 18, who was digging a ditch near by. Morris had never seen Beebe before in his life. But he aimed a rifle at him — and shot him to death.

And when police came for Morris he told them:

"I killed him because I wanted to die.

"I knew if I killed someone the police would have to come and get me — and I wanted to be killed myself."

Police asked him "If you wanted to die why didn't you just shoot yourself?"

Morris replied, "I knew I'd never have the nerve.

"This was easier. I just wanted the police to kill me."

And that's why he murdered a stranger.

It was a broken teenage romance that led to Morris' murder and suicide scheme in Well-Ed Lake, Mich.

He had been going with a 15-year-old girl and last October they ran off to Kentucky to try to get married.

But authorities caught up with them and brought them back. The girl's parents then refused to let their daughter see Morris anymore.

Morris brooded about it for several weeks. He later said "She's the only one who cared about me. There's no reason for me to live anymore."

Last November 6, while his stepfather was at work and his mother was out shopping, Morris turned from brooding to deadly action.

## A Stranger

### 'I Did It Because I Didn't Have the Nerve to Shoot Myself,' He Says

He took a .32 caliber deer rifle his stepfather had recently bought, loaded it and went to a window on the second-floor landing of the home. He later explained:

"Rather than cause anyone any trouble I decided I'd get myself taken care of.

"I was going to shoot somebody — anybody passing by on the road."

Morris didn't explain just how he thought no trouble would be caused by shooting an innocent man.

In any event, as he looked out the window of his home, he spotted Beebe.

Beebe was shoveling dirt from a shallow trench across the way. He was one of an eight-man crew, of which his father was foreman, digging a pipe trench

for a gas installation.

Beebe's father had gone for some extra equipment, while the other men had just gone for lunch. Young Beebe had eaten earlier and was all alone at the ditch.

Morris later said: "It could have been anyone who passed."

"But when I looked out the window and saw him over there, I just aimed the rifle and fired."

The shot hit Beebe in the left shoulder, knocking him down.

Terrified and unaware of where the shot had come from, Beebe staggered to his feet and

desperately tried to run away.

Said Morris: "I could see I had hit him but then he started to run."

"So I shot again, and then again. And he fell."

The second shot missed but the third broke Beebe's spine, pierced his lung and killed him.

Neighbors heard the shots and called police.

A dozen police raced to the scene and surrounded the Morris home.

They called to the boy to come out but he refused. So police crept through the base-

ment and upstairs.

They found Morris sitting in the kitchen — smoking a cigarette and drinking a glass of milk.

Morris then told police all about his weird reason for shooting Beebe and finally said:

"I did it because I didn't have the nerve to shoot myself."

"I just wanted to be put out of the way, that's all."

Last February 12 Morris pleaded guilty to second-degree murder.

And on March 18 Judge Philip Pratt put him out of the way — but with a life sentence.

According to the Times, Weissman had been asked by one reporter to comment on Lane's statement.

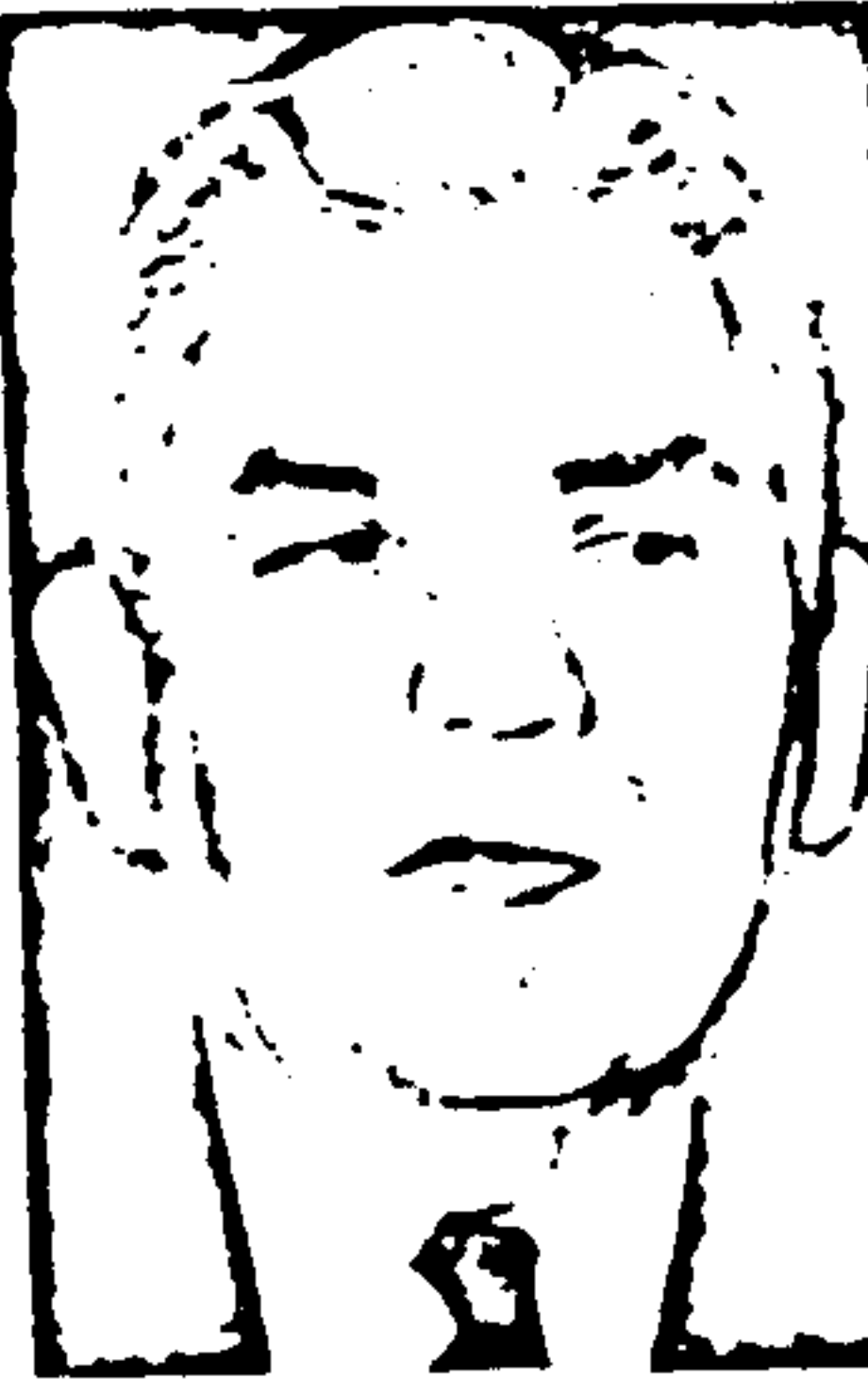
Weissman said that he had never met Tippitt or Ruby or Oswald.

And Weissman also said he had never been in Ruby's Carousel Club.

Then columnist Dorothy Kilgallen raised this "important question" in her nationally syndicated column on April 14.

"Why did Lee Harvey Oswald, presumably fleeing from the police after the assassination, approach Patrolman J.D. Tippitt's car — in broad daylight, with witnesses standing by — and shoot the policeman three times, although Officer Tippitt had not said a word to Oswald?"

"A man who knows he is

wanted by the authorities after a spectacular crime does not seek out a policeman, usually, unless he has decided to give himself up, and certainly Oswald was not doing that.

"By shooting Officer Tippitt, instead of trying to make himself inconspicuous, Oswald put himself in double jeopardy. His act almost guaranteed his arrest."

"Why?"

"A whodunit fan would infer that the policeman knew something about Oswald that was so dangerous he had to be silenced at any cost, even Oswald's chance of escape and freedom."

Oswald's mother, Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, pointed to still another possible explanation for the murder of Tippitt.

When Mrs. Oswald was asked, "Who killed Tippitt?" by Bob Considine of the Journal-American, she replied in his column of March 13.

"Nobody seems interested in how Lee got out of the Book Depository the day of the assassination. The place was surrounded by police, absolutely surrounded. Yet Lee walked right by them."

"You know how?"

"Because Tippitt took him out."

"Then the higher-ups in the conspiracy ordered somebody to kill Tippitt. Part of the master plan, the way I figure it. Marina's (Oswald's widow) part of it, too. CIA or one of those agencies."

Speculation that Oswald was not working alone was also voiced in a United Press International dispatch from London which was printed in the Newark, N.J., Star-Ledger on April 19.

"Millions of Europeans refuse to believe that the assassination of John F. Kennedy was not part of a larger conspiracy that has still not been exposed," the dispatch said.

"The most respectable newspapers and radio and television stations in western Europe feed this viewpoint by giving prominence to reports that insist that the late President was slain as part of a left-wing or a right-wing plot."

"On both sides of the Iron Curtain, the belief is widespread that Lee Harvey Oswald was not a psychopath who acted alone."

Many think he was the agent of a ring which most definitely included Jack Ruby as one of the conspirators."

The UPI report also notes that Serge Groussard, "one of France's best known journalists," wrote from Dallas:

"Very probably Ruby killed him to shut his mouth forever, for Oswald could not have acted alone."

In the United States, the Warren commission continues to listen to testimony from the many people concerned in the case.

But the most fantastic revelation to come to the commission was the communication from the Justice Dept. to the Dallas Police Department.

If this document exists, The ENQUIRER feels it is the right of the American public to know of it.

Is the Warren commission — and all other interested agencies and officials — keeping the lid on this shocking secret?

Only time will tell.

# CBS Newsmen Founded Fair Play For Cuba To Aid Castro

Broadcasters for Castro-in-cluding CBS-TV personnel--went to influence voters of Southern U. S. negroes. The Dec. 5 issue of The Councilor told how CBS passed taxpayer money to Gibson--a Fair

Play coeditor--through a "non-station" After this training program, he hired him to join Tabor in writing news programs for quillible Americans.

Meanwhile, these additional developments:  
(1) Radio man in Alice, Texas report that Lee Harvey Oswald tried to become a professional broadcaster.  
(2) A pal of the CBS pair named above (Waldo Frank) received a \$25,000 payment from Castro to glorify him in the U. S.

"He haven't been able to determine where Oswald was going," the investigator said. "He wouldn't tell us when we questioned him before Jack Ruby (Ruby-beneficiary) shot him. But we're convinced he didn't plan to return to the Oak Cliff room or to the Irving home where his wife and children lived."

"It wasn't cool enough at the time for Oswald to need the jacket (that he got from his room following the killing). He may have put it on to change his appearance. But it's more likely he thought he would need it at night."



It is apparent that Oswald knew that the killer rifle would be traced to him within a matter of 30 to 90 minutes, and he probably thought it would take a little longer to locate his lair on Beckley Street, near Ruby's apartment. If he planned to make a getaway--a fairly obvious fact--he would have to reach a rendezvous point with one or more accomplices within a few minutes after the shooting, or else make his way to a secondary rendezvous point such as the Texas Theatre.

He was headed straight toward Ruby's apartment when encountered by Officer Tippit.

The getaway was spotted by the alertness of sheriff's deputies in suburban Irving, Texas. When Oswald failed to answer a roll call in the Texas School Book Depository Bldg., he became a prime suspect. His communist connection apparently was not known at the time.

Recorded in the building showed that Oswald lived in Irving. Deputies Harry Weatherford, Buddy Walters and J. L. Oxford received an urgent call to check

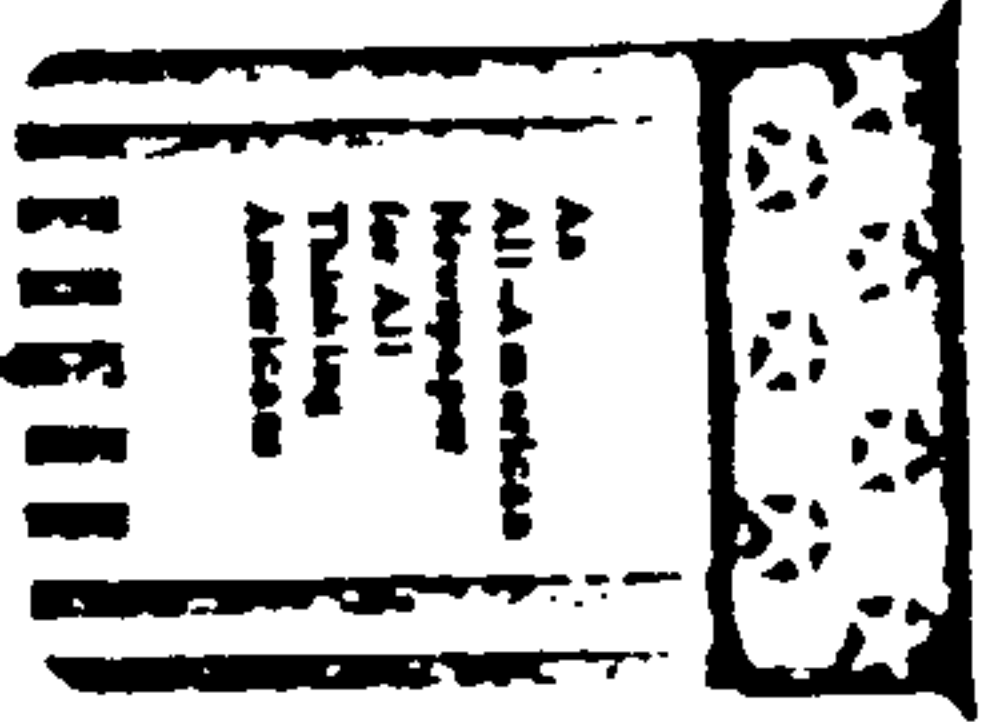

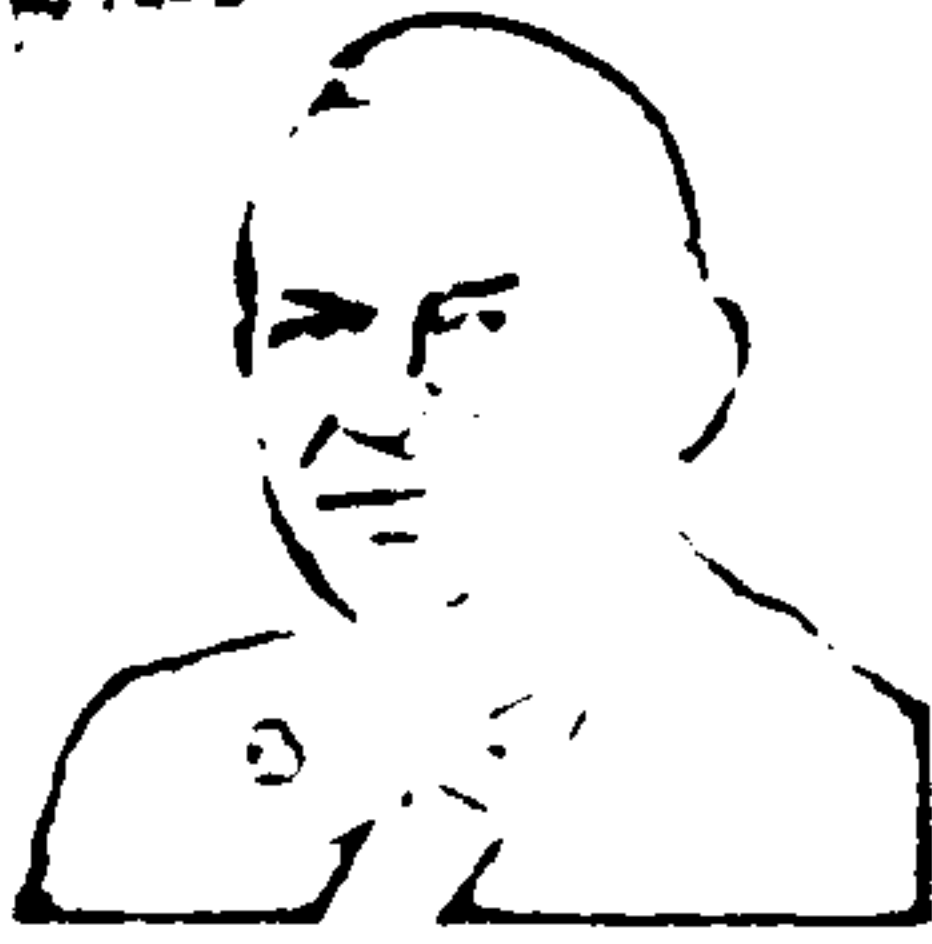
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# ASSASSINATION

## And Its Aftermath

*Congressman Martin Dies of Texas served seven years as Chairman of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, the historic Dies Committee. Now practicing law in Texas, Congressman Dies remains one of the most outspoken foes of the International Communist Conspiracy. He is author of the recent and explosive volume, Martin Dies' Story—which we recommend.*



■ IN THE FIRST chapter of Theodore Roscoe's *The Web of Conspiracy*, which is the story of the assassination of President Lincoln, Roscoe says that the murder of Lincoln by John Wilkes Booth could not be concealed by official censorship, or the government's juggling of English, or a propaganda treatment, or re-writing of history:

*What censorship, phrase-juggling, propaganda, and the doctoring of history did conceal was the fact that Booth could not have murdered Lincoln had not Lincoln been betrayed. . . .*

*The betrayal which permitted a lone gunman to walk into a theater in the nation's capitol and shoot down the President was securely bidden away.*

This concealment and distortion of the truth is a black chapter in our nation's history. Such a thing may be far more serious in the tragic case of

the murder of President Kennedy.

### I

IT IS DIFFICULT to understand why President Johnson at first approved a Texas Inquiry by the Attorney General of Texas, and then appointed a commission headed by Chief Justice Warren, and then yielded to Warren's insistence — *accompanied by a threat of resignation* — that the Texas Inquiry not be held.

What Constitutional authority is there for such a Presidential commission? Why was not the Committee on Un-American Activities, or the Senate Internal Security Sub-Committee permitted to conduct the probe? And why did President Johnson ignore the proposal of a close personal friend of the President and a member of the Presidential commission, that a bipartisan Committee of Congress conduct the investigation? Why was it deemed necessary to establish a commission of dubious Constitutional authority — to say the least — handpicked by a President seeking reelection?

Why was Chief Justice Warren appointed chairman of this commission? As a member of the Supreme Court he may even be confronted with the appeal of Jack Rubenstein. Though he disqualifies himself, his inconsistent roles as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and chairman of the commission may taint the findings of the commission, as well as a later decision of the Supreme Court. It has even been widely reported that Warren is on record as opposing the impropriety of



such a dual role. He did not, however, refuse the chairmanship. Why choose Warren when there are millions of Americans, rightly or wrongly, who do not have confidence in the Chief Justice because of his persistent defiance of the great legal principle of *stare decisis* (to stand by decided cases)?

The doubts expressed here are not meant to reflect upon the patriotism of Justice Warren or the other members of this commission. But, under our system of freedom, Americans have a right, and it is their duty, to ask such questions.

## II

WITHIN ONE HOUR of the President's death the Dallas police arrested Lee Harvey Oswald, and the fact that he was a pro-Castro sympathizer and a "Marxist" was made public. Nevertheless the usual "Liberal" spokesmen blamed the President's death upon "right-wing extremists" and "hate mongers." The Voice of America beamed to the world the indictment that Dallas was a city "of the extreme right-wing movement." *Tass*, the official Russian News Agency said: "President Kennedy of the United States has been assassinated. His death is blamed on extreme right groups." It reported that it got this information from the Voice of America.

Even after the news services published the facts about Oswald — his defection to Russia; his affidavit renouncing American citizenship; his residence in Russia; his record of Communist beliefs and activities, which were well known to our government and nationally publicized before the murder of the President — the spokesmen for so-called "Liberals," and the duped or uninformed, continued to link "right-wing extremists" with "left-wing extremists" as responsible for the murder. Oswald has almost always been described as a "Marxist" and not a

Communist, even after the evidence was conclusive that he was a Communist and that, like so many Communists, he used the words *Marxist* and *Communist* interchangeably. While it is true that Socialists, Social Democrats, and other Left-wing groups, as well as many so-called "Liberals," derive their social and political philosophy from Karl Marx, the only groups whose members label themselves "Marxist" are Communist. As a matter of fact the Communists have always contended that they are the only true Marxists in the world. After all, Karl Marx did write the *Communist Manifesto*.

To many uninformed people a Marxist is much different from a Communist. It is therefore extremely important for the "powers that be" to conceal or becloud the fact that the President of the United States was murdered by a Communist whose record of Communist activity was well known to our government; whose place of work on the day of the murder was well known to our government, and who was thus—knowingly—allowed a perfect opportunity to kill the President. The enforcement of our anti-Communist laws and the most elementary precaution could have prevented the dastardly act. Our government knew about Communist Oswald but it did not act as the law required!

## III

IT IS EQUALLY important for the government to convince our people that Oswald was acting on his own initiative and not in furtherance of a foreign or domestic conspiracy. (Later I will show why there has been a concerted campaign to disassociate Oswald from Communists at home and abroad.) On November twenty-third there was an *Associated Press* story from Washington which quoted authorities of the State Department as saying, "they have no evidence indicating involvement of

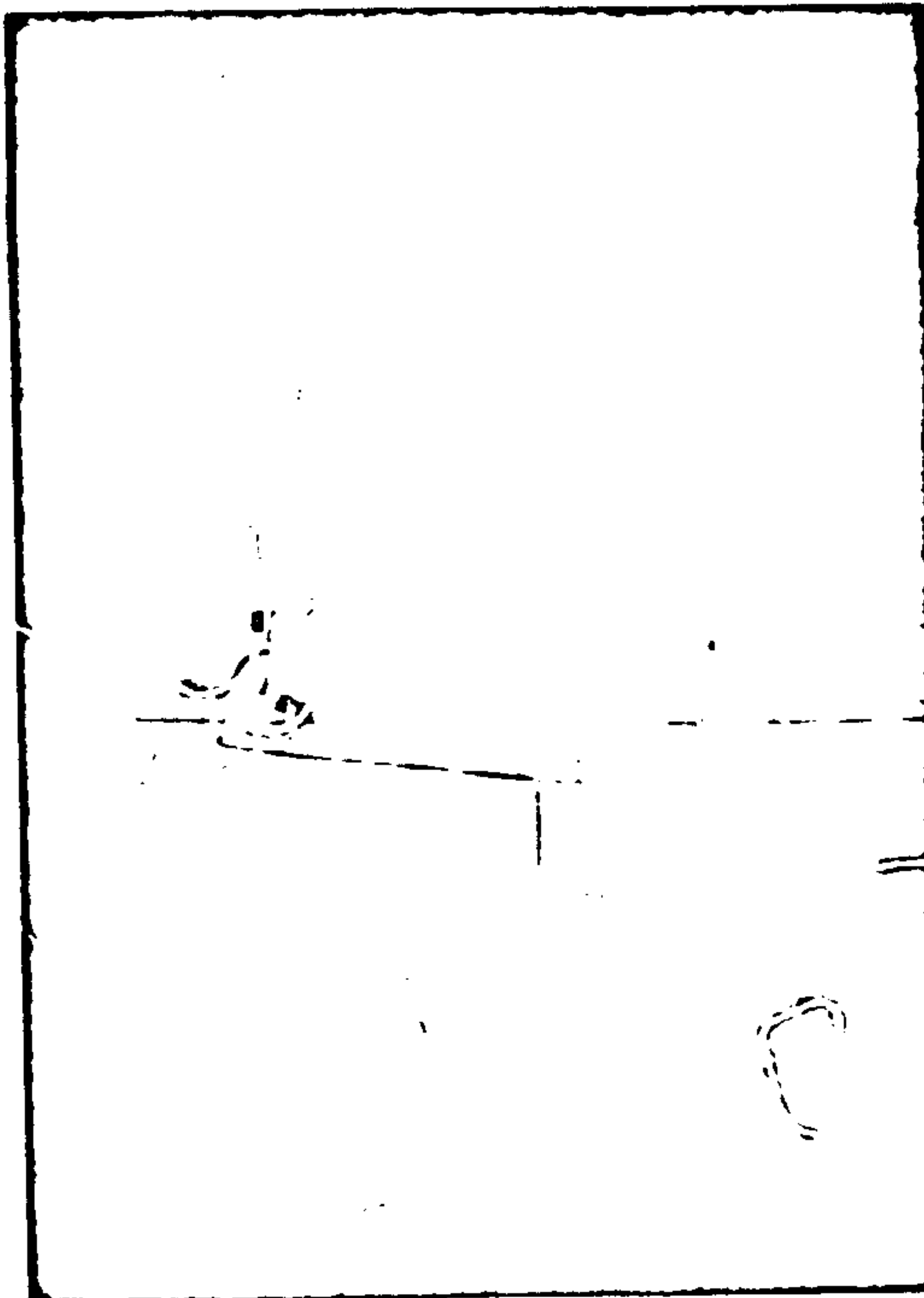
the Soviet Union or any other foreign power in the assassination of President Kennedy." The *Associated Press* said on November twenty-third that Oswald was a "loner" and kept pretty much to himself. This line was followed many times in the so-called "Liberal" newspapers and on television and radio.

Stories appeared in the newspapers to the effect that, when Oswald was a child in New York, a teacher warned of his mental condition. The "Liberal" columnists and television commentators continued to emphasize that President Kennedy was the victim of "extreme rightists and hate mongers." Ministerial associations, even in Dallas, warned against "extremists" and "hate mongers," CORE and NAACP issued a statement that President Kennedy was killed because he championed human rights (meaning the Civil Rights Program). Even President Johnson, in his first speech to Congress, warned against "extremists and hate mongers." In fact the vast majority of "Liberal" leaders, in and out of the government, seized upon this opportunity to divert attention from the all important facts that President Kennedy was shot by a Communist; that thirty years of investigation of Communism by Congress and by other countries proved the basic and elementary fact that every Communist must accept ironclad discipline and obey orders, and that Communists never commit political crimes except in obedience to orders of superiors.

In the first Report issued unanimously by the Dies Committee — composed of Democrats, Republicans, "Liberals," and conservatives — we found:

*The Communists in the United States openly admit their allegiance to the Communist International at Moscow, and glory in the fact that they obey all the orders issued from there immediately and implicitly. . . . The following statement appears on*

*the 1938 membership card of the Communist party, originals of which were introduced as evidence before the committee: "The undersigned declares his allegiance to the program and statutes of the Communist International and of the Communist Party of the United States of America, and agrees to submit to the discipline of the party and to engage actively in its work." . . . The Communist International is dominated by the Russian Communist party*

*and Soviet officials, and could not exist without the wholehearted support of the leaders of the Russian Communist party and the financial backing of the Soviet Government.*

That Report was submitted to Congress on January 3, 1939, and a copy of it went to every member of Congress and of the Executive Branch of the government. It was printed in newspapers throughout the country and distributed to public libraries. The quoted



excerpts have been reaffirmed by every Committee of Congress or agency of the Executive Branch which has ever investigated Communism. This principle of discipline (unquestioned execution of orders of superiors) has been demonstrated throughout the world upon too many occasions to enumerate.

It is true that since our investigation and exposure of Communists in this country the Communist Party stopped issuing cards and printing other incriminating evidence. But Communism is dogmatic. It may change its tactics from time to time to deceive the unwary, but its basic principle of absolute Party discipline, and its objective of world conquest, never changes.

#### IV

Is THERE any question that Oswald was a Communist?

The *Associated Press* in a story from Dallas quoted Dallas Police Chief Jesse Curry as saying that Oswald admitted he was a Communist. Curry added, "He didn't try to hide it." In another *Associated Press* story from Dallas, dated November twenty-eighth, Dallas Police Chief Curry is quoted as saying: "He [Oswald] readily admitted he was a Communist. Apparently he was proud of being a Communist. Last year Oswald said in New Orleans he was not a Communist but a Marxist. But actually Oswald has never drawn any distinction between the two."

District Attorney Henry Wade was quoted by the *Associated Press* as saying, "There was lots of material (in Oswald's room) dealing with Communism, such as the *Daily Worker* [sic] and there was even more material dealing with Fair Play for Cuba Organization." In the same story Chief Curry is quoted as saying that, after Oswald's arrest, photographs were found "showing him standing at attention with a rifle in one hand and in the other a copy of the Communist

newspaper, *The Worker*."

When Oswald was arrested, according to the *Associated Press*, "he announced he wanted for his lawyer John Abt of New York, well known for past Communist defendants."

An *Associated Press* story dated November twenty-fourth reported that "When Oswald on November 2, 1959 turned in his American passport to our Embassy in Moscow he presented his affidavit which stated: 'I affirm that my allegiance is to the Soviet Socialistic Republic.' And he told American Embassy officials, 'I am a Marxist.'"

Four years ago, in Oswald's interview with Priscilla Johnson, on the third floor of Moscow's Hotel Metropole, he referred to the Soviet Government as "my government" and he said: "Even if I am not accepted [for citizenship] on no account will I go back to the United States." He said (and this was a most significant statement) that when he talked to Soviet officials they warned that neither Oswald's wish nor theirs would determine whether his citizenship application was to be accepted. They said it depended on the "over-all" political atmosphere at the moment. Meanwhile they offered Oswald the sanctuary of a prolonged stay in the U.S.S.R.

The husband of one of Oswald's landladies (he had a room for his wife in Oak Cliff and a room for himself near his job under the name of O. H.
